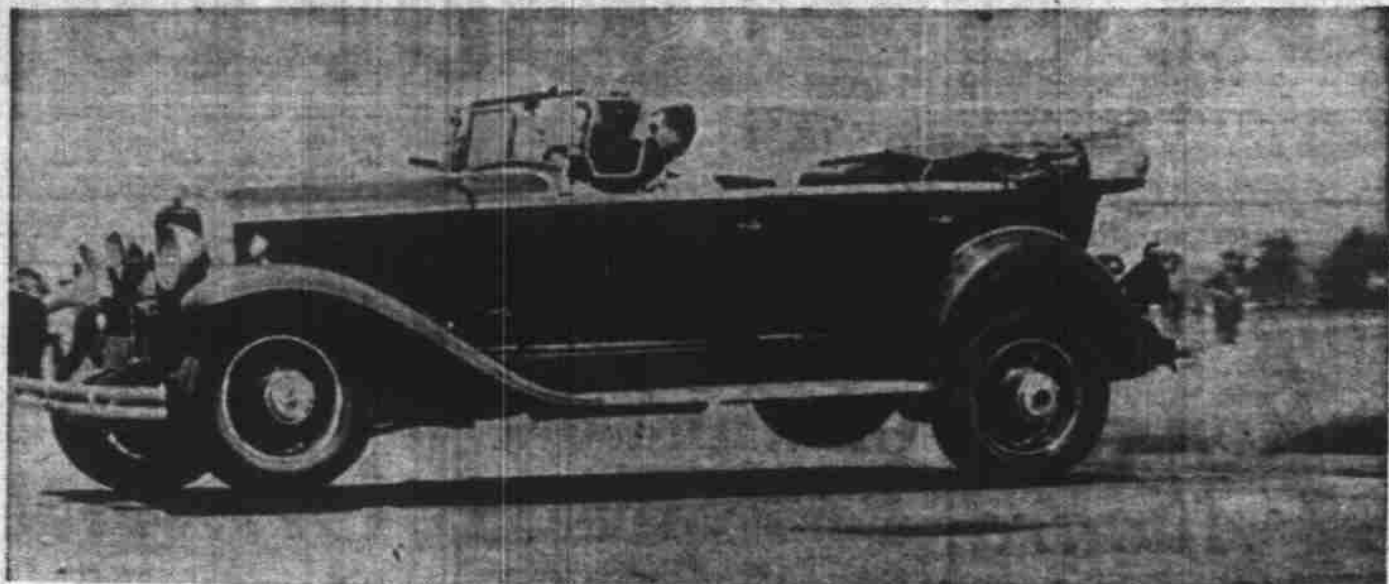

Blowout at 70 Miles Per to Thrill Crowd Today

Car Wrecks Keep Aid Car Occupied

Victims of car wrecks, with 10 listed, topped the cases treated by officers of the Floyd B. McMillen first aid car last month, two patients succumbing.

The car travelled 318 miles on 54 calls, treating 56 patients. Patients were recorded in the report as: Poison 1, shock 1, car wrecks 10, sick 2, pedestrians hit by car 3, police investigations 3, heart attacks 2, fights 1, kicked by horse 1, cut by axe 2, bicycle falls 3, hit by rock 1, minor cuts 7, suffocation 1, burns 4, car and bicycle collisions 1, falls 1, exposure 1, eye injuries 1, dog bites 1, epilepsy 2, caught in machinery 3 and nasal hemorrhage 1.

Stabilizer Brings Steering Safety

Blowouts, even two of them on the same side of the car when it is traveling 70 miles an hour, cause no swerving of the machine equipped with the new Bendix hydraulic steering stabilizer, which will be demonstrated in Salem today for the first time.

Postponed from several weeks ago because the men in charge were called east to demonstrate the car before a government agency, the demonstration here will be held this afternoon at 5:15 o'clock, on Cottage street between D and Marlon.

Tires will be blown out with a shotgun strapped to the running board, and the car will leap over sandbags and logs in different tests to show that the stabilizer does not permit any loss of control under these trying conditions.

Apportionment of School Fund Made

A \$1.80 per pupil apportionment of the county school fund was made here yesterday by Mary L. Fulkerson, county superintendent, to bring the 1938 payment up to one-half the year's total due by law. The aggregate payment to the school districts will be \$35,182.80. Superintendent Fulkerson said she hoped to be able to finish the school fund distribution late this year, depending on how taxes come in. The county budget committee last year levied for the school fund at the rate of \$19 per pupil, although some students of the school law maintain a levy sufficient to insure full payment of the fund, regardless of tax delinquencies, should be made.

Equalization Body Ends Tax Hearing

The state board of equalization adjourned late Wednesday, after conducting a large number of hearings involving utility property assessments. The board is composed of the three members of the state tax commission. Property valuations of utilities for 1938 will be considered in making the state tax levy for 1939. The 1939 tax levy will be announced in November.
