

Northern Fire Toll 20 Dead

Grim Ontario Police Keep Searching for Several Missing in Zone

(By the Associated Press)
Grim, weary Ontario provincial police Wednesday searched a fire-blackened homestead area boundary for several missing settlers as the known death toll along the Minnesota-Ontario from Monday's fire rose to 20. Unaccounted for were two families. The fate of Fred Hendry and the Dolph families, residents of Kingsford township 50 miles northwest of Fort Frances, was unknown. The number in the families was not available. Several farm buildings and a schoolhouse in Mincampbell township four miles north of Fort Frances, were burned Monday.

Both districts are in the vicinity of Dance township, scene of the greatest fire, where 17 persons are known to have perished. Meanwhile the fire, which seared through the little farming settlements in Dance and adjacent townships, raged on toward Clearwater lake, a thinly populated resort country. Scores of volunteer fire-fighters labored in hot winds and acrid smoke.

The tragic story of a frantic mother who perished in the flames with an 18-month-old son, a 12-year-old sister and a husband whom she sought to warn, was unfolded today with the discovery of four more bodies.

Family Is Trapped
Sam Fyle, 21, apparently was working in the woods not far from his home in Dance township, police said, when the rampaging flames bore upon his home. Mrs. Fyle, 19, an expectant mother, her baby son and her sister, set out on foot to warn him. The trio reached him, but the four were overtaken as they sought to flee the licking flames. Ten persons were under treatment for burns, several in serious condition, in a Fort Frances hospital. Many were survivors of families partially wiped out by the blaze.

Living evidence of the benefits Salem derives from the activities of the seven agencies grouped under the Salem Community Chest was marshaled again at the Rotary club luncheon Wednesday noon. Some of the speakers were the same who spoke at the chamber of commerce luncheon Monday. These included Mary Ross Holts of the YWCA, Joe Cronin of the Catholic charities, Norma Koon of the Salvation Army and Eva Burgess of the YMCA.

Mayor Kuhn Speaks
New speakers were Dayton Robertson of the YMCA, who described his personal outlook on the values of that institution to youthful members and to the community, and Mayor V. E. Kuhn who represented the board which supervises Hotel de Minto. Chinook Egg Take In Hatcheries up

ASTORIA, Ore., Oct. 12.—(AP)—Hugh Mitchell, superintendent of fish culture for the state fish commission, said today commission hatcheries had made a "better than normal" take of approximately 52,000,000 chinook salmon eggs this year.

McKenzie river and Bonneville hatcheries headed the list with more than 15,000,000 eggs each. Commenting on Bonneville dam's much discussed fish ladder, Mitchell said chum migration over the big dam had dispelled early fears that sluggish fish would not attempt to negotiate the barrier.

Liberty Poultry Raisers Bring 298 Pullets From Batch of 300 to Laying

LIBERTY—Mr. and Mrs. J. T. Bullock were unusually fortunate in raising their present flock of pullets in that they brought 298 of the 300 into egg production. The White Leghorn chicks were purchased last spring and raised to more than eight weeks of age without a single loss. Later two were lost.

About 50 per cent of the pullets began laying at four and a half months old and nearly all were laying at five months. They were started on mash and scratch feed, electric brooders were used at first and their feed changed as the fowls developed. Nothing extra ordinary was used or done in raising the chicks except that extreme care and sanitary methods were used throughout.

Interurban Lines May Be Continued

PORTLAND, Oct. 12.—(AP)—The Portland Traction company management considered a proposition from 80 employees today to accept 10 per cent of their wages in promissory notes to prevent abandonment of interurban trolley service between Portland, Oregon City and Gresham.

Service curtailment was suggested in a retrenchment movement. About 1214 workers, the majority employed in the city, declined an offer to defer 10 per cent of their pay for six months.

State Patrolman Shot During Hunt

Assertions 'Libel' Says GOP Nominee

Sprague in Speech Hits Hints WPA Is Lost if He's Elected

GRANTS PASS, Oct. 12.—(AP)—Assertions federal assistance would be withdrawn if Oregon elected a republican governor were called a "libel on the humanitarian purposes of President Roosevelt" by Charles A. Sprague, republican nominee, last night.

Henry Hess, the democratic candidate for governor, has been quoted as saying Oregon projects would be endangered if he were not elected. Sprague said federal assistance had not been discontinued in other states where republicans were in office.

"I yield to no man in the matter of concern for the well being of my fellow man," Sprague said. "I want every employable man in Oregon on a good job at good wages. Until that time comes, the WPA and the state relief agencies must function properly to care for those who need their assistance."

Satterwhite Runs Afoul Law Again

PORTLAND, Oct. 12.—(AP)—The law and Lester Lee Satterwhite, 44, were at odds for the third time today.

Satterwhite was indicted on a manslaughter charge after an automobile collision which killed his companion, Elmer S. Bell, and seriously injured Glen R. Mettsker, defense attorney in the Mrs. Agnes Joan Ledford murder trial, last May. Three months later he was convicted of reckless driving and his operator's permit revoked.

Last night Detective Sergeant John Schum arrested Satterwhite on a charge of driving an automobile without a permit.
