ELDRIDGE—Pearl Patterson, fruit grower on the Wheatland Ferry road has been busy the past week harvesting a second crop of Cuthbert raspberries. According to Patterson \$16.59 was realized from his two-acre tract with two days picking. He found a ready market for the berries in Salem stores and received 13 1/2 cents per pound.

This is the third time in the past eight years that this patch has yielded a second crop. The mild weather the past few weeks ripened the berries which are large and full-flavored.

A few years ago this crop bore fine berries until December 10. If cold weather and rains don't set in, the fruit will continue to ripen late this year as the vines are heavily loaded with green fruit.
