Scio Council Accepts WPA Wage Dictum Over Strong Objections

SCIO — Exaction of the PWA 62 1/2 cents per hour for labor at a minimum wage scale to prevail on the proposed Scio civic water main improvements passed by a three to two vote of the Scio council Monday following a heated discussion of the subject.

Councilmen Bartu and Roadarmel argued strongly against the rate, maintaining that it would be squandering hard-earned tax money when common labor could be had at 40 cents an hour.

Though other councilmen agreed to the argument, Bryan, Sims and Withers voted in favor of the demand, stating that it was "that or nothing." It appears the PWA will not consider furnishing financial assistance unless the higher scale is used here.

The proposed improvements in Scio will cost approximately \$22,000 including a bond loan of \$12,000 and a grant of approximately \$10,000. Work is to start by January 1, according to the PWA.
