Irrigation Eyed By Polk Farmers

200 Acres Already Are Surveyed for new Projects on 3 Ranches

DALLAS—According to requests coming in to the office of County Agent Leth for assistance in developing new irrigation projects there will be a number of new farmers practicing irrigation next year.

Leth has about 20 new irrigation prospects listed, most of whom have very good water prospects.

Leth states that this is the best time of year to prepare for irrigation particularly on those farms where irrigation by the flood method is to be practiced. The land is easier fitted in the fall including the leveling and preparation of levees than it is in the spring, owing to the lack of surplus moisture in the fall. It is also possible by fall seed-

ing the grass part of the pasture mixtures for irrigated pasture to have a satisfactory pasture the following season. When this practice is followed, a ladino clover seed sowed about the last of February or first of March is best.

Recommendations concerning pasture mixtures, advantages of various types of irrigation and recommended irrigation practices can all be secured through the county agent's office.

Last week about 200 acres were surveyed and plans developed by Art King, irrigation specialist from OSC, and Leth, for new projects on the following farms: E. W. Staats, Monmouth; Paul Froemar, Williams; and A. C. Lamb Dallas.
