Elsinore Has Aviation Saga

1910 Model Blériot Ship
Appears in Opening
"Men With Wings"

A duplicate of the 1910-model airplane in which Blériot made his record-breaking flight across the English Channel appears in an important sequence of "Men With Wings," the Technicolor cavalcade of aviation, coming today to the Elsinore theatre.

William A. Wellman, director and producer of this story of the growth of aviation during thirty-five years, secured the antique plane from Mrs. Catherine Daugherty, widow of Earl Daugherty, greatest of the early California pilots, who has had the plane in storage since the days it was flown.

Story of Three Men
"Men With Wings" tells the story of three young Americans caught in the tremendous surge of aviation from the flight of the Wright brothers in 1903 to the present day. As the three friends are swept forward by the swift current of aviation progress, the great events of the history of flying are seen in the background: the flight of Kitty Hawk, Blériot's crossing of the English Channel, the World War sky battles, the first airmail flight, Lindbergh's epoch-making New York-to-Paris hop and, finally, the breathtaking round-the-world flights of Wiley Post and Howard Hughes.

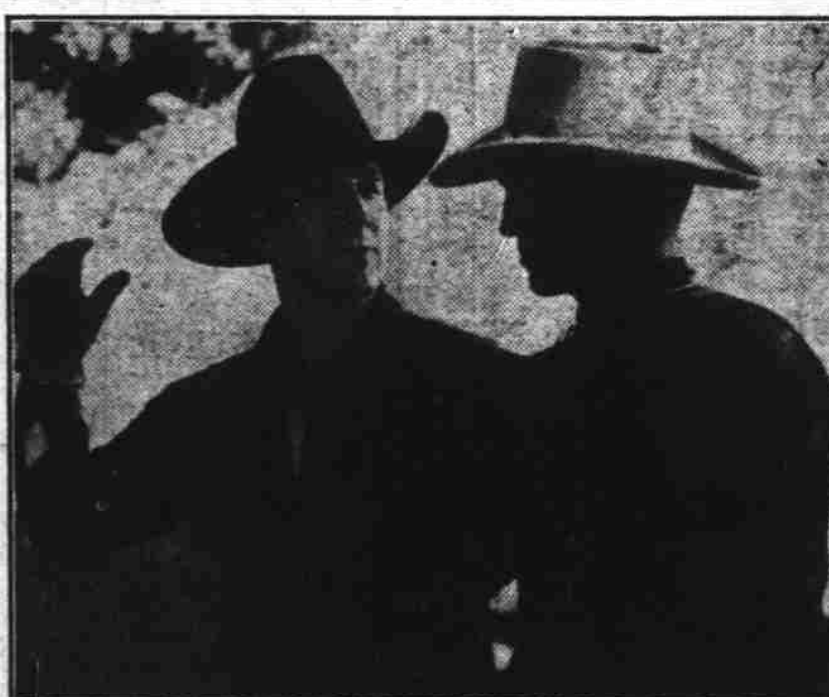
