An eight-pound, 15-ounce son was born to Mr. and Mrs. Carl Schulke Tuesday.

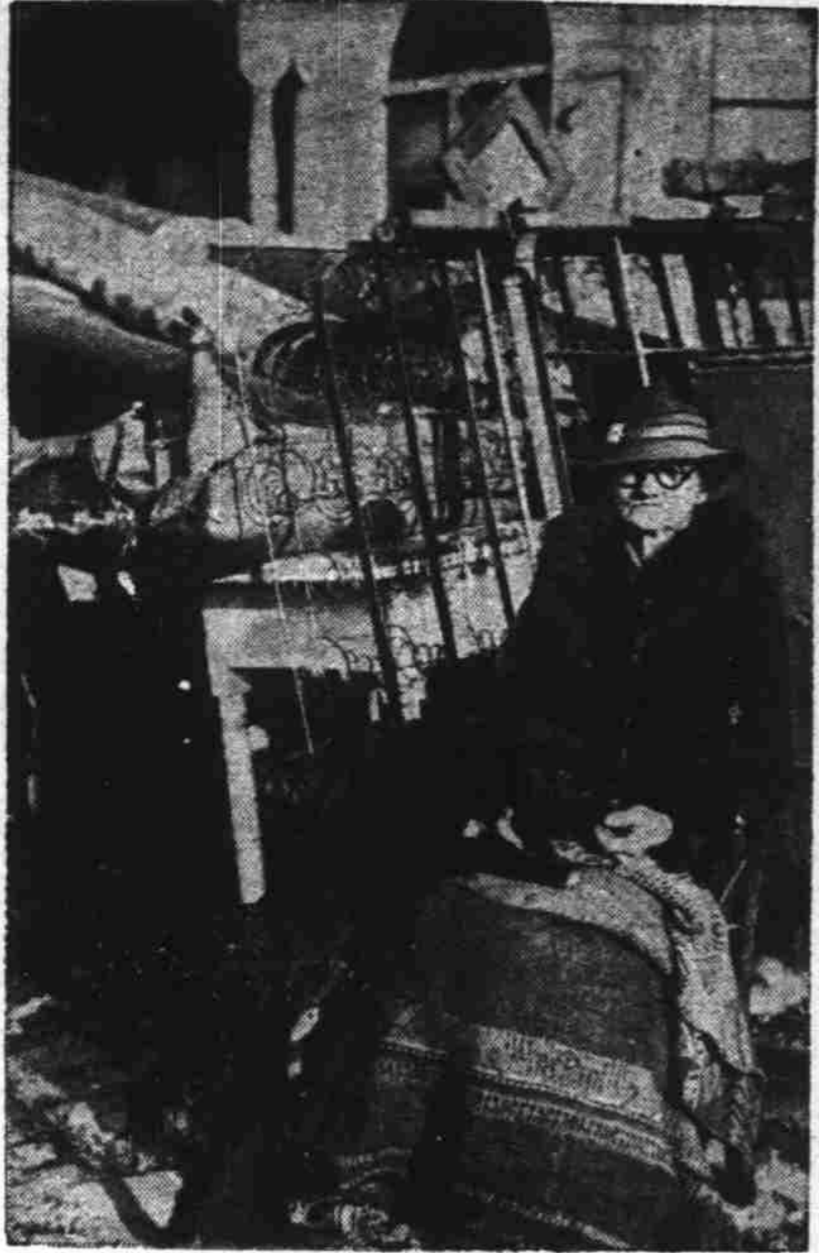
In Court for First Time at 110
