

Fascist Japan Looms; new Cabinet



At behest of extremist nationalist elements, Prince Fumimaro Konoye recently resigned as premier of Japan. Succeeding him, Baron Kichiro Hirayama, fascist inclined president of the privy council, was commanded by Emperor Hirohito to form a new cabinet. Among the demands which forced Prince Konoye to resign were more rigid governmental control of economic life in Japan, new policies to secure Japan's conquest in China and a single political party.—(HIN).

Beer Store Gets Out of the Draft

PORTLAND, Jan. 5.—(AP)—The customer is always right with managers of a Salem grocery, meat market and service station, the state liquor control board said today.

The operators asked that their request for a retail beer license renewal be denied, and a package store license issued instead. Their explanation was that they did not like to have customers drink on the premises, but did not want the customers to feel services were being curtailed.

Action was deferred on applications of five Eugene places adjacent to the University of Oregon campus for beer licenses. The license renewals were protested by Dr. Donald M. Erb, university president, but they were approved by the Eugene city council. Commission Chairman Arthur K. McMahon said the body would investigate more fully before acting.

Consider Training Pilots in Oregon

PORTLAND, Jan. 5.—(AP)—A plan to enable Oregon college students to participate in federal training of 20,000 pilots in colleges and universities each year was considered today by Allan Greenwood, aeronautics inspector, and the state board of aeronautics.

Greenwood said he would confer with the state board of higher education on the availability of the plan to Oregon schools.

President Roosevelt approved the program, which will be introduced with \$100,000 of national youth administration funds in not more than 12 educational centers during the present school year. The full program calls for one-year training for 20,000 pilots at a cost of \$9,000,000.

OSC Winter Term Enrollment Soars

CORVALLIS, Jan. 5.—(AP)—Registrar E. B. Lemon said today second day registration at Oregon State college for the winter term reached 4064, compared with 3781 on the corresponding day a year ago.

The major schools showing the most substantial growth were science, education, agriculture and secretarial science. The freshman class is eight per cent larger, sophomore eight per cent smaller and the upper classes 30 per cent larger than in 1938.

Co-eds showed the greatest increase, although men still outnumber the women 2746 to 1313. Enrollment already is larger than the final total for the winter term last year and officials predicted a high mark of about 4496.

New Wage Scheme Presented Unions By Furniture Mill

PORTLAND, Jan. 5.—(AP)—A new wage plan was offered to 1099 employees, idle since last October, by the Doernbecher Furniture Manufacturing company last night. The union will consider the suggestions tomorrow.

The plant closed when the employees declined to accept a 10 cents an hour reduction.

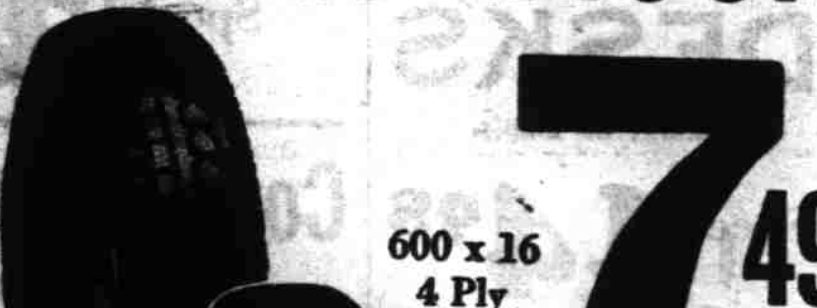
