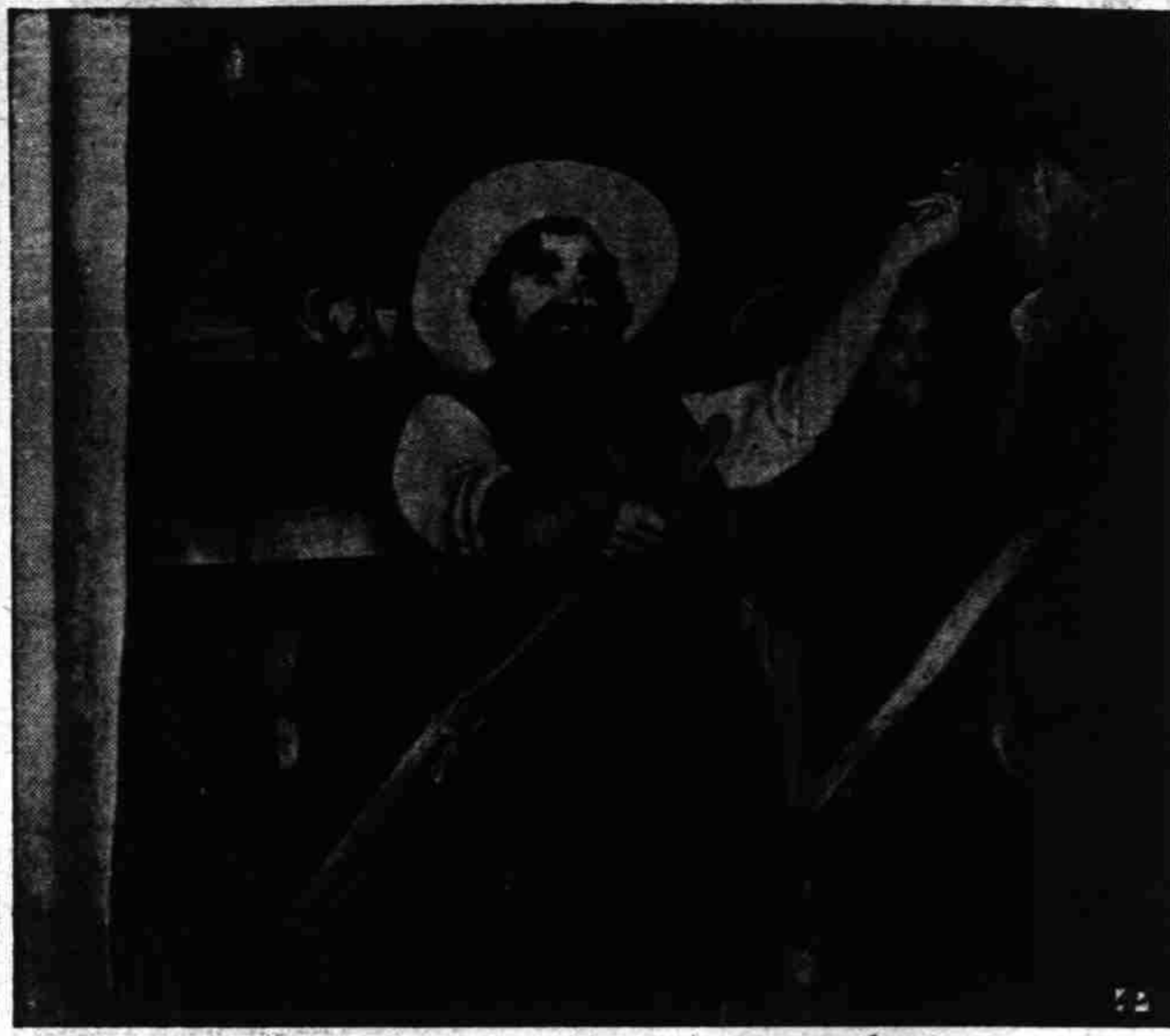

Church Built Near Aurora 87 Years Ago Rededicated to Methodist Work

Built in 1852 with lumber hauled to the ground by ox teams, driven by Eb Boyington and Clark McCowan, it was one of the first three Methodist churches in this state, although that was seven years before Oregon was admitted to the union.
