Baked halibut will be the main dish for today.

HALIBUT BAKED IN CREAM
Wipe fish and remove skin, place in baking dish, sprinkle with salt and pepper and brush with melted butter. Drain juice from large can of tomatoes for 2 pounds of fish and add a tablespoon of sugar. Spread over fish, then cover with thin slices of onion. Bake 20 minutes in moderately hot oven. Pour 1/2 pint cream over it and bake for 10 minutes more. Remove onion and serve while hot.
