Funeral Services Held Also for D. W. Lawrence of Lebanon Area

LEBANON—Following funeral services at the Harry C. Howe funeral home Saturday at 3 p. m. for Peter LaBounty, 80, the body will be placed in a vault at Salem until good weather, when it will be moved to the family lot at Chippewa Falls, Wis., accompanied by his daughter.

LaBounty was born at Moorestown, N. Y., October 22, 1848 and was married in Wisconsin in 1872 to Maria Belle Wella who died in 1908. He came to Lebanon seven years ago to make his home with his daughter Mrs. H. A. Bull. Surviving are two other daughters, Mrs. Laura Morehouse and Mrs. Mary Hoyt of California; four grandchildren; eight great grandchildren; three sisters and two brothers in Nebraska.
