Sugar Beet Quota Is Proposed Again

Large Crop Calls for AAA Marketing Step by Processors

CHICAGO, Feb. 23.—(AP)—B. H. Benidt, economist for the AAA sugar section, this week submitted a tentative proposal to set up marketing quotas for sugar beet processors.

Benidt was the first witness to appear at a public hearing opened by the department of agriculture sugar division on the allotment of marketing quotas for the domestic sugar beet areas.

A bumper beet crop, which it is estimated will produce approximately 215,000 short tons of beet sugar over the 1939 quota, prompted the hearing.

Suggested Formula

Benidt proposed that allotments be made according to a formula based on past marketing and processing of the 1938 crop, with emphasis on latter. The processing of last year's crop, he said, should be given greater weight than past marketing "because it reflects more recent accomplishment."

Benidt said the tonnage of sugar which could be expected to be marketed in 1939, "in the absence of any restrictive marketing allotment" amounted to approximately 1,800,000 short tons, raw value. This, he said, was approximately 215,000 short tons in excess of the 1939 quota. The 1939 quota allowed for 1,584,524 short tons, raw value.

Water Service Request Studied
SCIO—Joe Drdlik's request for city water service extension to his residence in the west outskirts of Scio will be among matters to be considered by the Scio city council at a regular meeting March 2. The request was presented to the council at the February meeting and referred to committee. A similar request by residents in south Scio was recently denied.

J. F. Ouper received surgical treatment for an eye affliction at Salem this week. Ouper has been water superintendent for the city of Scio for a number of years, and recently has served also as city marshal.

A. J. Arnold, 74, is reported still seriously ill at his home two miles east of Scio on Thomas creek.
