

Census Taken For Catholics

Local Incomplete Count Shows 13,738 Persons in Salem District

The Catholic census, taken three days in mid-February, shows 13,738 individuals and 2922 families in the parishes of the Salem district, on the basis of incomplete returns.

Rev. Reedy Conducts Census

Of the present total for the state, 37,409 are adults, 21,058 are children under 18 years old, in 17,950 families.

When the first Catholic missionaries arrived in the Oregon country in 1838, their first census, taken after their first mass, showed 76 persons, whites and Indians, in the Hudson Bay company fort at Vancouver.

Posing as G-Man Puts Portlander Into Law's Hand

PORTLAND, March 2—(P)—Charles E. Kerr, 24, had a yen to be a G-man so he got some kind of a star and posed as one, a procedure he discovered later was disapproved by the government.

Federal Judge James A. Fee, after listening to a story of Kerr's "investigations," sentenced him to a year in federal prison and probated the sentence for five years when he promised to "stop trying to make people think he was a big shot."

The principal victim of Kerr's detective work was a friend, Don Luloff, who became a sort of man Friday to him on promise of a job after a five-year apprenticeship. Luloff financed the "investigations" and told the court he had spent about \$725.

Rose City's Auto Toll Stands at 15 Deaths

PORTLAND, March 2—(P)—The death of Oscar F. Anderson, 77, today brought Portland's traffic fatalities for the year to 15. The elderly pedestrian was knocked down by an automobile Sunday night. Thirteen of the victims have been pedestrians, most of them more than 60 years old.

\$428,178 Granted Washington State US Social Security Body Acts on Assumption new Law Oked

WASHINGTON, March 2—(P)—The social security board, acting upon the assumption Washington's new "stop-gap" pension legislation qualifies it for continued federal aid, granted the state \$428,178 today for old age pensions in March.

This was the first grant since Washington's legislature approved emergency acts "correcting" the state social security law which officials here said had been rendered inoperative, so far as the federal government was concerned, by a recent state supreme court decision.

The decision held all persons 65 or older were entitled to old age pensions, irrespective of need. Officials explained that under federal law, pensions could be paid only after an element of need had been established.

An attaché first said today's grant was made under the old law pending study of the new, but later an official said:

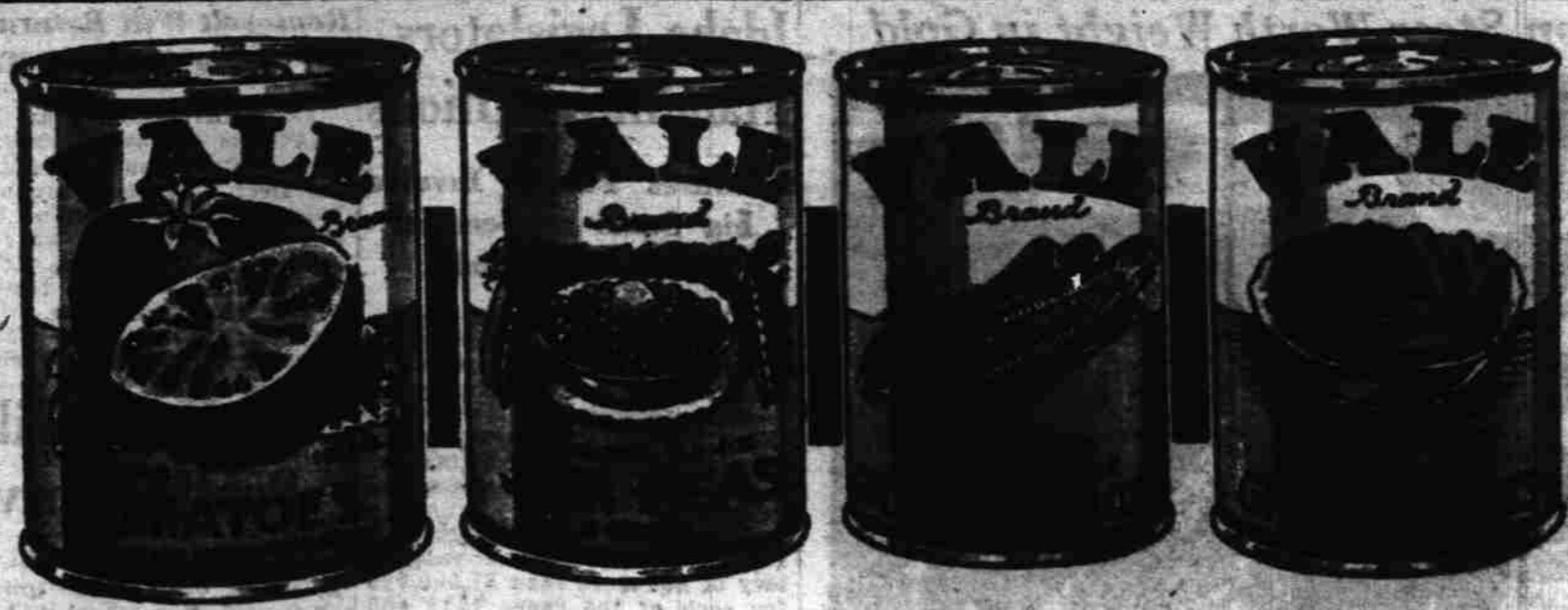
"While the board has not yet seen the corrective legislation reported passed by the Washington legislature, it feels that it should not withhold the March allotment."

(The new legislation, in addition to specifying "need" as a requirement, makes \$30 the maximum instead of the minimum pension and says relatives are morally responsible for support of the aged.)
