

### US Road Deaths Drop in January

2500 Highway Casualties Is 6 per Cent Fall Over Year Ago

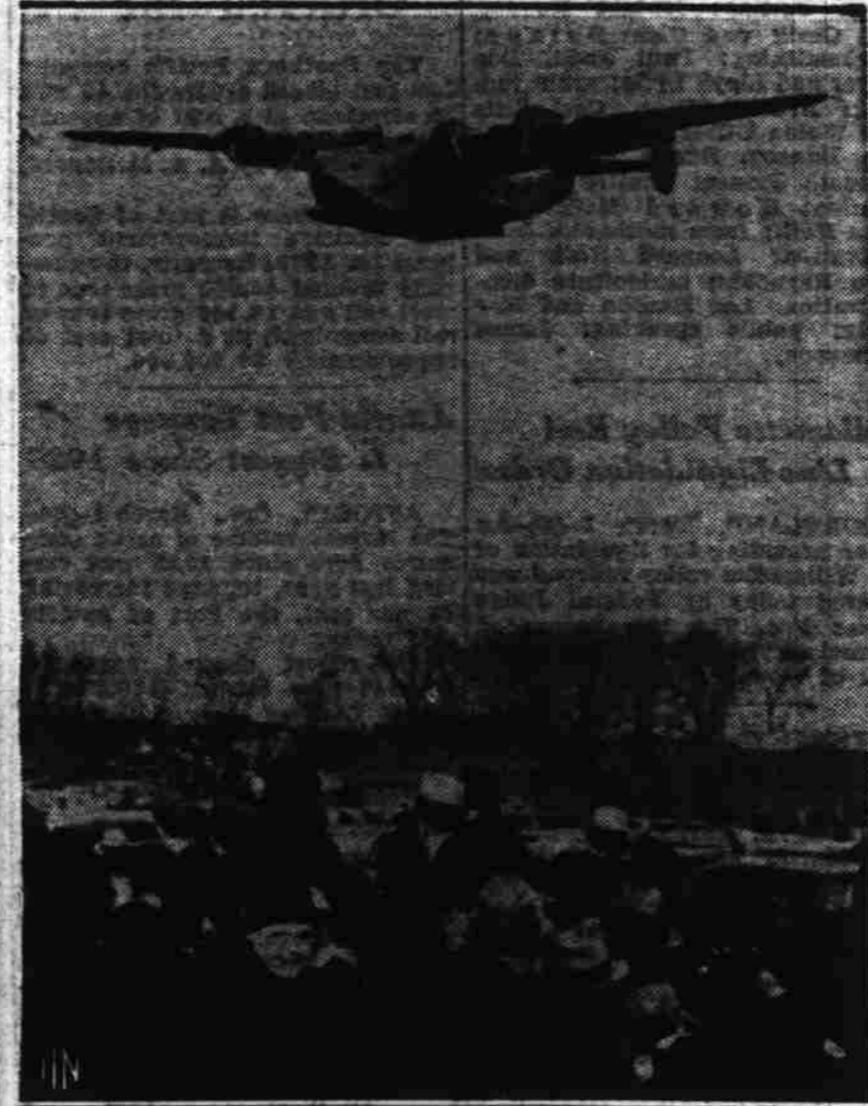
CHICAGO, March 1.—(AP)—Highway deaths declined in January for the 15th consecutive month, the national safety council reported today, with a resulting saving of 3,500 lives since November, 1937.

Wyoming showed the greatest proportional improvement with a drop of 89 per cent. New York theoretically saved the most lives, 34, by reducing deaths 18 per cent from a year ago. Indiana was second with 24 lives saved, a reduction of 24 per cent.
