Start Forebay For Feed Mill

Sci Co Plant Switching From Electricity to Water Driven Power

SCIO—Work probably will start within the next week on excavation for a new forebay for the Sci Mill & Elevator company of Sci, one of the largest feed mills in Linn county.

Installation of two water wheels will be made for power for the company's machinery, which has been electrically operated since the former building and mill race installation were destroyed by fire in 1928.

J. D. Densmore, sr., manager of the company, states that the forebay will be approximately 22 feet deep and of heavy concrete construction. Construction will be completed within three or four weeks.

Other Improvements
The company four years ago excavated a mill pond in preparation to returning to water power as a means of reducing operating expenses. Both the mill and warehouse buildings have been constructed within the past few years. Two large turbines will com-
