## State Schools Send Speakers

### Fifth Annual High School Contests Here Today With 100 Entrants

Over 100 high school students from all over the state will arrive on Willamette university campus today to participate in the fifth annual Oregon high school speech contests sponsored by the Willamette university speech department with R. M. Murphy, director of forensics, in charge.

In the championship series the classifications are extempore, oratory and serious and humorous interpretations. The junior series, a new section this year, is open to an unlimited number of students from each school while in the championship division each school is entitled to only one contestant. Every contestant in the championship series will speak in the first two rounds before any eliminations are made.

**Willamette Students Judges**  
Coaches from each school are judges in the championship series and the Willamette speech students are judges in the junior series. The total registration exceeds that of a year ago and 21 schools have entered. The contests will be held in Waller and Easton halls with the latter headquarters. The public is invited to hear these contests.

Registration will close Friday at 3 o'clock with the first rounds of interpretations, orations and extempore in the afternoon. In the evening, round two will be held for the various events with an announcement of results of preliminary rounds. Saturday morning the semi-finals will be held, with the finals in the afternoon, beginning at 1 o'clock. The time for the rounds of speaking in the junior series will be arranged and announced after the complete registration this afternoon.

## Eley, Jr., Enters National Contest

### Young Salem Man Is One of 15 US Finalists; Architect Prize

Frederick Eley, Jr., of Salem, is one of about 15 finalists nationally in an architectural competition, the winner of which will receive a two-year fellowship at the American Academy in Rome, it was announced at the Salem Lions club meeting Thursday noon by Barkley A. Newman, Young Eley, whose father is a local architect, is a member of the club.

This is the first time that a resident of the Pacific northwest has reached the finals in this annual contest, Newman explained. The preliminary competition, open to graduates of schools of architecture, consisted of a 24-hour problem which this year consisted of designing campus and buildings, both academic and residence, for a college of 350 students. Young Eley engaged in this contest at the University of Oregon. The final test will begin April 29, and will consist of a nine-hour problem, the nature of which will be previously unknown; after the general layout is drafted in that period, the contestants will have five weeks to develop details. The fellowship is worth \$2000 a year in addition to full expenses of travel to and from Rome, Newman explained.

## Rogue River Mud Cleanup Demanded

GRANTS PASS, April 20.—(P)—An old sore, mud in the Rogue river, was a irritated anew today with a demand by the Curry county district attorney, Grant J. Williams, that the river coordination board, created at the last legislative session, start work. Williams, in a letter to board members and the state department of geology and mineral industries, asserted that the river was extremely muddy at Gold Beach and that while many salmon were being caught near here, few were being taken in Curry county. Curry sportsmen have long contended that mining operations in Jackson and Josephine counties muddy the river and endanger fish life. The board is empowered to make fishing conditions in the counties comparable.
