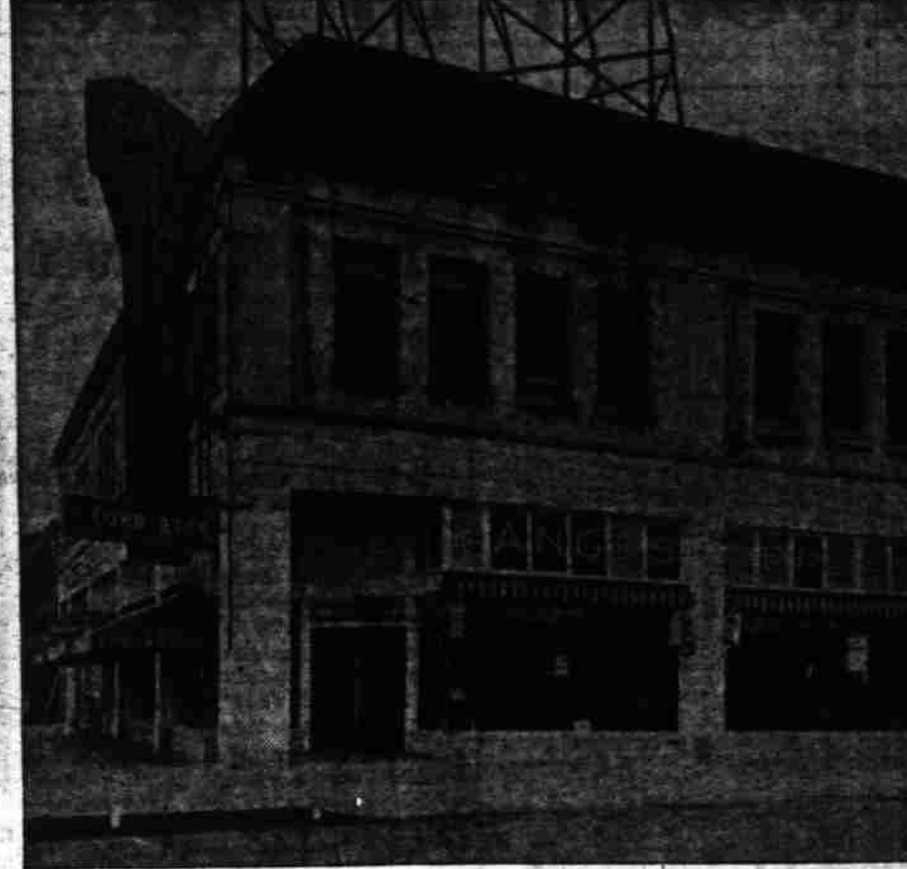

Reports on Butter Alarms Governor
Alleged Misgradings of State Shipments Will Be Studied, Says

Governor Sprague Saturday addressed a letter to R. E. Cavett, secretary-treasurer of the Oregon Creamery Manufacturers association, in which he said he was deeply concerned by reports that a minority group of the United States department of agriculture had arbitrarily reduced the rating and grading of Oregon butter without seeing the product.

"I feel that the state is more or less the tail of the federal kite when it comes to grades and standards and agree with you that the place to make representations is with the federal department of agriculture," Governor Sprague said.

Cavett, in a letter to Governor Sprague, said the situation was so serious that it may turn back the growth of the Oregon butter industry a score of years or more.

He added that at a recent hearing by the state agricultural department in Salem, one large co-operative creamery admitted a loss of \$3000 since the first of the year on account of the new arbitrary grading system.

Governor Sprague informed Cavett that he would go into the matter further, both to ascertain the nature and effect of grade changes and to determine the best course of action.

Governor Nearing Job Appointments

Three Major Officers in State Commissions to Be Named Soon

Three major appointments are now under consideration by Governor Charles A. Sprague, it was indicated in the executive department at the capitol yesterday.

The governor is studying qualifications and preferences of several possible appointees each for positions on the state liquor control commission and the highway commission and is expected in the near future to appoint the real estate commissioner, whose position was created by the last legislature.

The man who will administer the new realty department will be a republican and probably a Portland resident, the governor intimated.

Call to Resign
Impending change in highway commission personnel is due to the desire of Henry F. Cabell, chairman, to be freed from his state duties. The governor has not decided definitely whom he will appoint in Cabell's place.

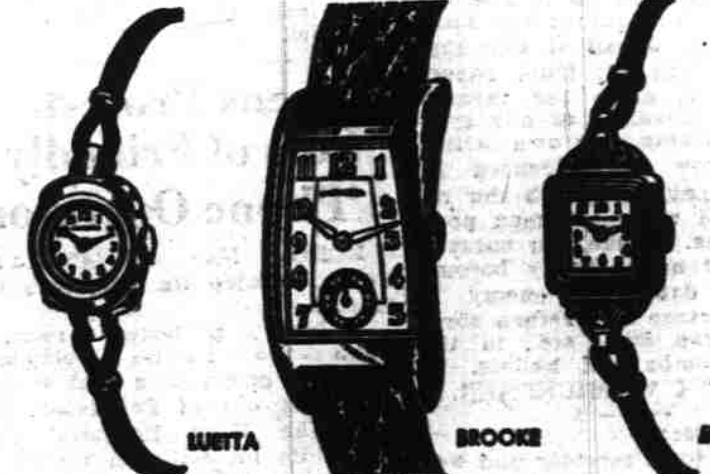

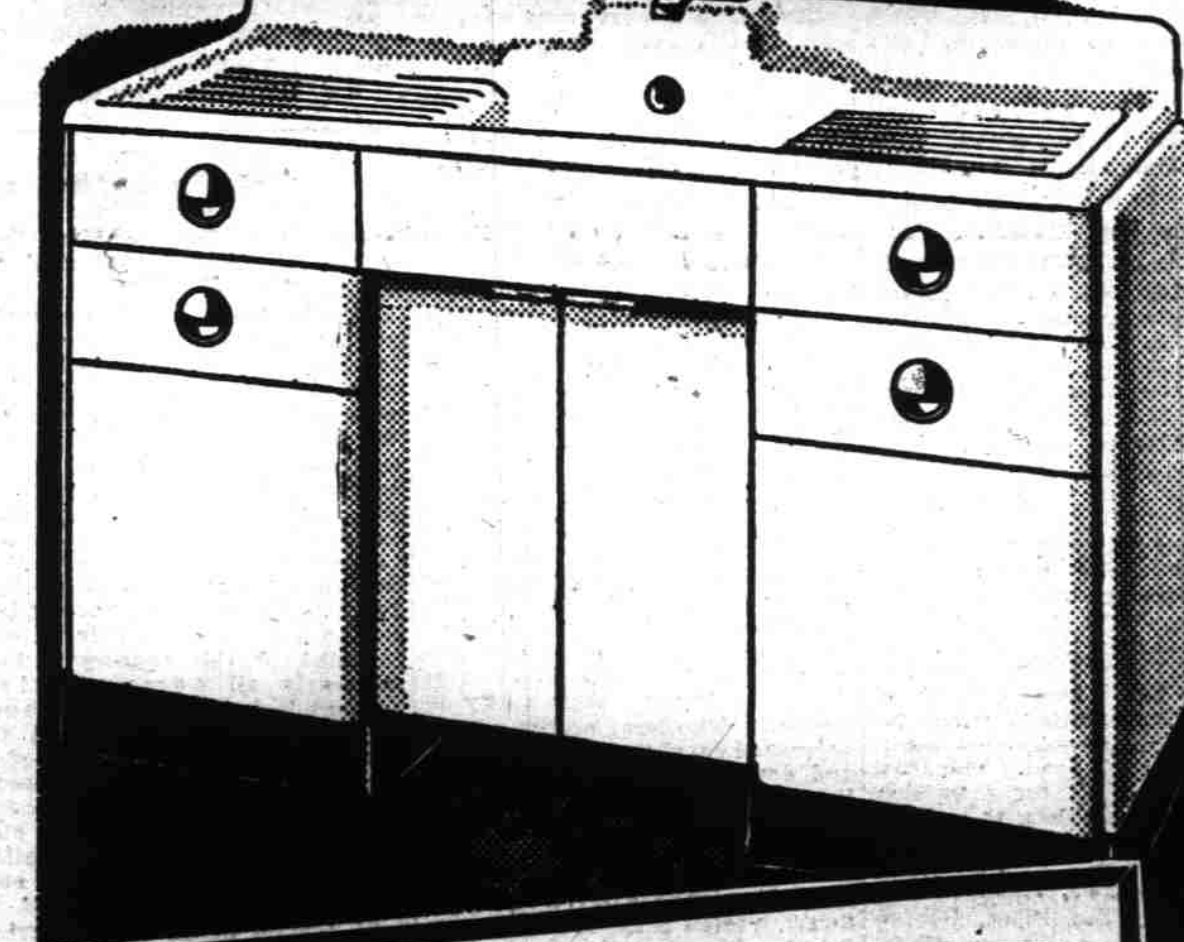
