Well Main Topic For Water Board

Arrangements for placing the Salem water department's new well on Stayton Island in service will be discussed at tonight's meeting of the water commission, Chairman L. M. Doughton announced yesterday. R. E. Koon, consulting engineer, will be present to make recommendations.

Test pumping of the well, originally to have ended Wednesday, will continue at least until tonight, Doughton said. Although the well has been pumped continuously at a rate in excess of 1500 gallons per minute since Monday noon, its level has never dropped more than five feet and the water has promptly surged back up during brief shutoffs of the pumping equipment.

The well is 16 inches in diameter, 60 feet deep and located but a short distance from the water supply pipeline which it will help feed during the dry summer months.

West Salem Pave Job Starts Today

Paving of West Salem's streets under the citywide WPA surfacing program will be started this morning on Gerth avenue, WPA officials indicated here yesterday. A total of five miles of streets will be hard-surfaced before the project is finished.

Nearly all streets included in the program, representing the developed parts of the city, have been graded and a large amount of curbing already laid.

The original estimated cost of the project, \$190,361, apparently will prove high, WPA officials said, although the city's share may be higher than the \$45,500 anticipated. A bond issue of \$50,000 was floated to finance the work.

Manley not After School Board Job

Francis E. Manley announced yesterday he had decided not to seek a position on the Salem school board at the June 19 election.

"There are four candidates up now and that makes it a good race," he explained. "I'll stay out this year and probably run next."

Manley had secured the necessary nominating petition forms for use in case he decided to become a candidate. His withdrawal from the field apparently closed the nomination lists.

Completed petitions nominating W. F. Neptune and E. A. Bradford, incumbent directors, have been filed, School Clerk W. H. Burghardt announced yesterday. Roy Harland and Donald A. Young, who recently said they would seek the two positions, have not yet presented their petitions for filing and checking.
