Report Is Given On Roads, Fishing

C. C. Charlton, district ranger in the Detroit-Breitenbush area, makes the following report on road and fishing conditions in that section

Roads: The Breitenbush road is in excellent condition to Breitenbush springs, not open for through travel to Breitenbush and Olallie lakes as yet because of snow. Elk lake road open to Beachie saddle, fair condition though somewhat rough. Scar mountain forest road open about 4 1/2 miles from North Santiam highway. Pamella lake road open approximately 3 miles. Marion lake road open to end. Big Meadows road is open but rough. Fishing: Fishing is generally fair now in streams, fish rising to flies now in North Santiam and Breitenbush rivers. Elk lake has been good with cut because being made on spinners. Pamella, Tumble and Marion lakes good. Other lakes accessible are Daly, Parrish, Opal, Rainbow. No reports available at this time on Square, Round, or Suttle lakes in the Deschutes forest.
