## Davies and Andres Are Bound Over

Silverton Cases Aired in Justice Court; Both Men out on Bail

SILVERTON—Two men were bound over to grand jury for further investigation of their cases following preliminary hearing here Friday before Justice of the Peace Alf O. Nelson. The defendants are Irving Davies, accused of taking tools from the mountain cabin of Mayor Zetta Schlador; and William Andres, charged with malicious injury to property in attempting to force his way into the home occupied by Victoria, his former wife. Davies told the court the tools found by his eldest son in the brush about 100 feet from the cabin, and that he presumed they had been dropped there and did not know they belonged to the cabin. He is at liberty on \$250 bond. Live in Same House In the Andres case, the divorced wife said they had been divorced some years ago and that they had lived in Silverton, in the same house, since last November. She said she had locked him out of the house Thursday, and that he tried to get in through the basement with a wrecking bar, and that she was afraid she would hit the children if he forced his way into the kitchen. He denied using a wrecking bar, and claimed that he simply removed a lock which he has put on the lower door. He said it was meal time and he had to get into the kitchen to eat as well as to take medicine. He is out on \$500 bond.

## Construction of Polk County Fair Building May Be Started Next Week

MONMOUTH—Word has been received here by H. W. Moran that the WPA allotment of \$10,042 for construction of the Polk county fair building unit and football stadium for OCE is now available. If materials can be secured work may be started next week.

The first plans for this project, which is to be erected on a 10-acre tract belonging to the city, lying west of the OCE football field, have been changed to include improvements to the original draft.

Lyle Bartholomew, Salem architect, designed the stadium. It is to be 160 feet long, 40 feet wide and 38 feet all at highest roof point. Fourteen rows of seats and ramp above; with a division of arrangement below approximating the state fair stadium.

Other buildings are the main one, 168 by 80 feet for exhibit displays; stock barn, 64 by 30 feet; and 20 by 10 foot building for comfort stations. Prompt federal administration of this project-application was evidenced by its speedy allocation. It is believed that ground-work will begin by July 1. The original local contribution of \$2,000 now stands at \$3000.

## Poultry Housing Bulletin Available

One of the most popular extension bulletins at Oregon State college, that dealing with poultry housing, has been re-issued and is now available for distribution, after former supplies were temporarily exhausted. The bulletin contains sketch plans and specifications for a considerable number of poultry house units found practical here in Oregon. Plans are included for laying houses and for a 25-hen house. Plans are also given for home construction of many types of devices, including mass troughs, nests, water devices, liquid milk feeders, litter carriers, dropping boards, green feed hoppers, wire porches, ventilators and electric wiring. One section of the bulletin deals with the control of wet litter by floor heating and shows several plans for this and results that have been achieved. A good poultry house is one which provides comfortable surroundings in which fowls may be kept in an economical and convenient manner, according to the authors, F. H. Kistner, H. E. Cosby and F. E. Price.
