

### Last Rites Today For Lebanon Men

Harvey Edwards, Former Businessman, Darius Kingsbury Called

LEBANON—A Christian Science funeral service will be conducted Friday at 2 p. m. at the N. C. Lowe mortuary chapel, for Harvey A. Edwards, 77, retired business man of Lebanon, who died June 27 following a lingering illness.

Mr. Edwards was born in Westparry, N. Y., January 15, 1862; went to Wisconsin and later to Minnesota, where at Morrisville he was married May 26, 1886 to Della A. Rohl, who preceded him in death. They came to Oregon in 1912 and Mr. Edwards engaged in the grocery business, retiring in 1935. At one time he owned two stores in Lebanon and one in Eugene; following his retirement he built a greenhouse on his home lot.

Survivors include three daughters, Mrs. Jessie Fowler, Lebanon; Mrs. Maude Stevens, Harrisburg; Mrs. Gladys Workman, Salem; one son, Merton Edwards, Lebanon business man; ten grandchildren and one great grandchild; one brother, V. Edwards, California.

Darius Kingsbury LEBANON—Darius Kingsbury, 87, progressive farmer and stock raiser, died at his home on route 3, June 28.

He was born in St. Lawrence county, N. Y., May 20, 1852; he came to Oregon many years ago from North Dakota and engaged in farming.

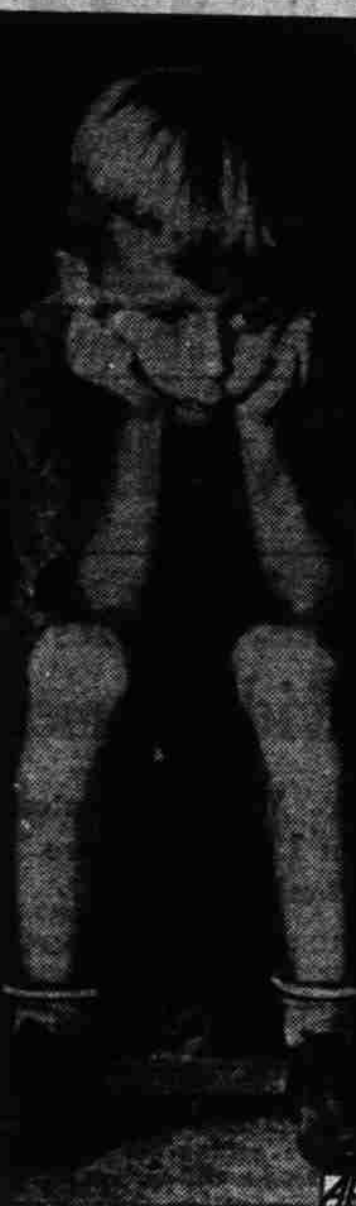

### Scio Main Street To Get new Span

Construction of \$10,500 Bridge Due to Begin by August 1

SCIO—August 1 is the date set by Linn county commissioners for beginning construction on the new county bridge across

Thomas creek on Main street in Scio. The structure, to cost \$10,500, will replace the present bridge, in use some 30 years. A temporary wooden bridge has been constructed by the county two blocks east of the present bridge. Two months will be required for completion of the bridge.

To Repair Well Proposals for cleaning and reoperating the casing of the Scio city well on the north side are expected to be considered

by the council at a regular meeting July 6.

The well was drilled about six years ago to a depth of 205 feet, but is believed not to be producing at capacity. Councilmen called for bids last week for testing and improvements to the water supply.

Preparations are underway to recover tools lost at the bottom of the new well on the south side. The new well did not produce sufficient water at the 350-foot level when drilling was terminated. Councilmen are investigating drilling of an auxiliary well near the site of the present one on the north side.
