**Mrs. Schrein
 Is Convicted**

Jury Holds Beck's "Gifts" Were Obtained Through Forgery, Larceny

NEW YORK, June 29.—(P)—A jury today rejected the explanation of Mrs. Lillian Schrein that large sums of money she took from Martin Beck, theatrical producer and her husband's uncle, constituted the gifts of a man to his mistress.

The twelve men convicted her of two counts of forgery and one of grand larceny, involving a total of \$69,000—only a fraction, the prosecution contended, of the amount she took from the 73-year-old Broadway figure to spend on lavish living. She will be sentenced July 7 and the maximum penalty would be 30 years in prison.

Mrs. Schrein, 38, mother of three, dark and comely in a heavy-featured way, took the verdict stoically, but her husband, Bertram, the object during the trial of the expressed scorn of both state and defense counsel, wept bitterly.

Beck is absent. Beck was not in court. During the trial he flatly denied Mrs. Schrein's testimony that they had been illicitly intimate over a period of years and her assertion that after submitting to his "advancements" as she put it, he had told her:

"I want you to have everything that will make you happy. I want you to have charge accounts in the stores and everything, because in my declining years this is a revelation to me."

The jury found specifically that Mrs. Schrein had forged a \$1,875 check to a fifth avenue clothing

store, issued in the name of Beck's wife, Louise, that she had committed a similar forgery in the unauthorized sale of certain of Beck's securities, and that her payment of a second check to the clothing store—this one for \$1,000—constituted larceny.

Assistant District Attorney Herman McCarthy contended that while the thefts formally charged against Mrs. Schrein, Beck's former secretary, amounted to \$60,000, she actually had made off with about \$370,000 of the old man's money.

State Farm Price Index Shows Gain

CORVALLIS, June 29.—(P)—Oregon's farm price index gained over last year in comparison with the national situation, the Oregon State college extension service outlook report showed today.

Oregon and national prices were 64 per cent of the 1926-30 average, representing a two-point gain for Oregon but a one-point

decline for the United States. The greatest variation since 1938 is shown by crop conditions, instead of prices. The national outlook on June 1 indicated an output 7 per cent less than a year ago.

Prospects for fruit and nut crops generally were favorable. Apples were better than average in central and eastern states but slight under average in the west. The California prune crop probably will be smaller than 1938 but the prospects are favorable in the northwest.

WPA to Improve Portland Airport

PORTLAND, Ore., June 29.—(P)—WPA approval of funds to surface two more runways and pave a taxi-area on the Portland-Columbia airport virtually assured removal of operations of United and Northwest airlines to the new airport from the present Swan Island field.

United agreed to erect large hangars at the new field and Northwest agreed to lease a portion of the proposed new quarters.

Airline officers indicated that as soon as the civil aeronautics authority approved the \$106,000 additional improvements, both United and Northwest would move their operating equipment to the field.

Coos Bay Eagles Ask 1940 Meeting

ROSEBURG, June 29.—(P)—Formal opening of the 24th annual state convention of the Eagles lodge was too slow for Coos Bay delegates today. They set up headquarters earlier to campaign for the 1940 meeting.

Delegates to the convention were poured into town on special trains from Portland and Klamath Falls, received the city's key from W. F. Harris, city council president, and got down to business early.
