Over 5 Thousand Predators Killed

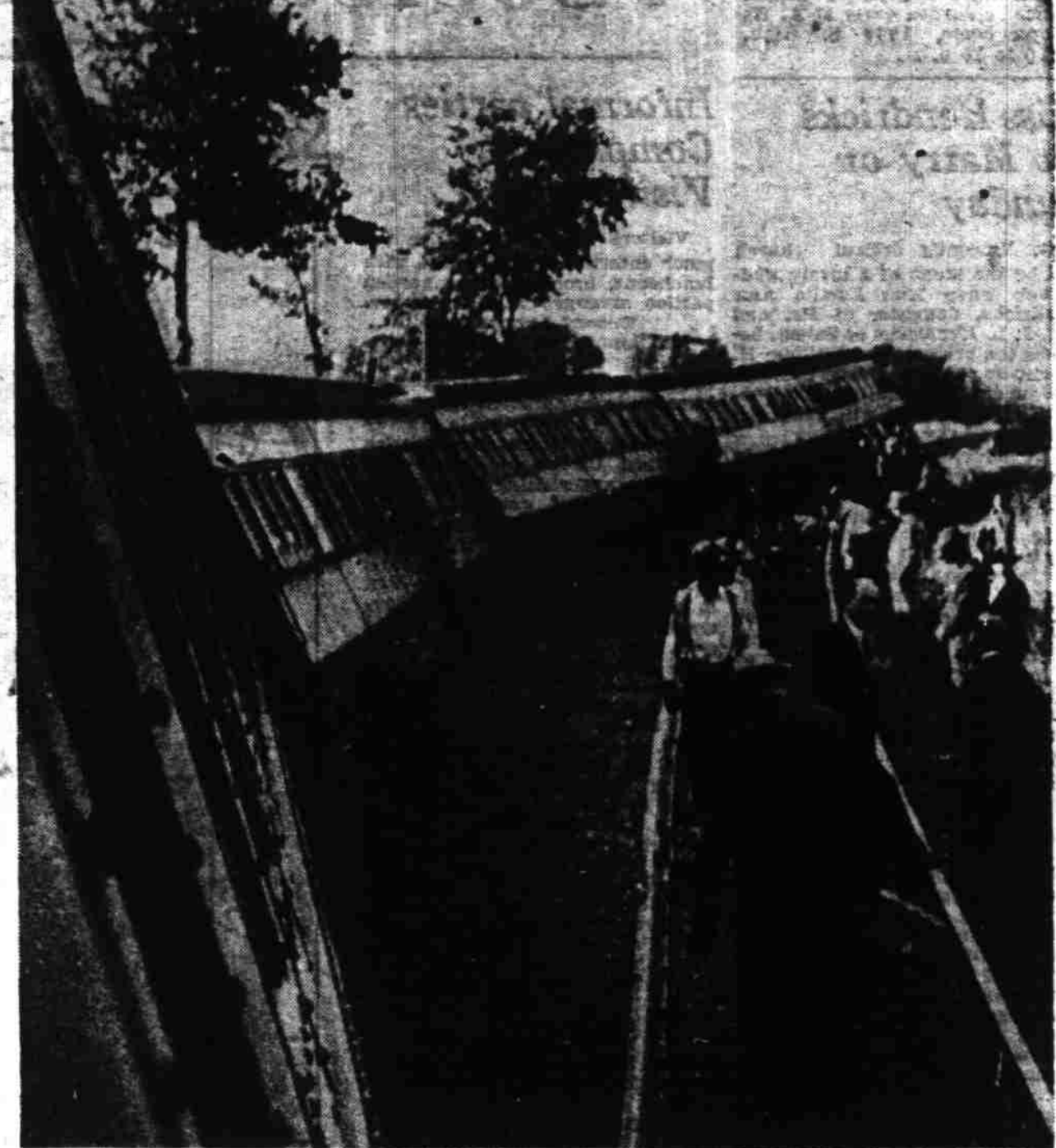
