

### CIO Workers Sued by AFL

Suit Is Culmination of Long Lumber Trade Argument

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 10.—(P)—A two-year-old split in northwest lumber unionism reached circuit court today when the American Federation of Labor filed an \$11,269 action against approximately 1200 Congress of Industrial Organizations workers.

Naming officers and members of CIO local No. 3, Lumber and Sawmill workers' union, and the parent organization, International Woodworkers of America, the suit sought recovery of funds and property claimed to have been taken when workers left the AFL.

Garnishment papers were filed against CIO officers and wages due about 385 employees at the Jones, Multnomah Box, Inman-Poulsen, Eastern & Western, Portland, Clark-Wilson, Kingsley, B. F. Johnson and West Oregon Lumber companies. Garnishment also was instituted against all Portland banks carrying workers' accounts.

Attachments were asked on CIO office equipment, L. Presley Gill of Seattle and Fred Jensen, Portland, AFL attorneys, asked a deputy sheriff be stationed at CIO headquarters until \$1349 was paid.

The suit charged that before workers joined the CIO, funds were checked out of AFL local No. 2532 and returned as a loan to avoid claims by the brotherhood of carpenters and joiners, principal unit of AFL lumber unions.

The suit was assigned by the brotherhood to the Portland district-council, Lumber and Sawmill workers.

### 200 Attend Tour To See Irrigation

CORVALLIS, Aug. 10.—(P)—Oregon State college experiment stations were inspected today by 200 farmers and businessmen at the start of the 10th western Oregon irrigation tour.

The procession of 75 cars will travel through Lane county Friday from the Stout farm on the Eugene-Coburg road.

Experts told the tourists blackberries under irrigation for 13 years had increased in yield 36 per cent, raspberries 110 per cent. Henry Hartman, head of horticultural research, said the quality had improved and the cost per pound decreased.

Extension Specialist Art King, who organized the first tour, presented reports showing irrigation increased profits on all crops. Studies were particularly directed to hops, beet seed, vegetables, seed crops and pastures.

Since the first tour, irrigated acreage in western Oregon has increased from 2000 to 25,000 acres.

### Fall Down Ship's Stack Is Fatal to Workman

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 10.—(P)—William Storey, 40, ship-fitter, fell nearly 100 feet down the inside of the stack of the liner Mariposa today and was killed when he landed on a boiler. Storey was working near the top of the stack when he slipped and plunged downward.

### Lower River Highway Crash Kills Portlander

ST. HELENS, Aug. 10.—(P)—William Gann, 26, of Portland, was killed when the car in which he was riding went off the lower Columbia river highway near Prescott and plunged 30 feet.

Gerald Macaulay, Portland, and Jennings Vogue, Portland, were injured. Macaulay was driving. State Patrolman Hollis Jones reported.

### Restaurant Reply To Union Is Due

PORTLAND, Aug. 10.—(P)—Arbitration of a wage dispute, suggested by the American Federation of Labor joint culinary council, hinged today on a reply expected tomorrow from the Associated Restaurants of Portland.

A proposed 10 per cent wage cut was refused by the union. Carl T. Fredericks, council secretary, charged owners had inserted blind newspaper advertisements seeking workers in event of a tie-up. He also said the union accepted a five per cent cut last winter with the understanding it would be restored in May.

Not all restaurants made the reduction. Fredericks said some had restored it and some had not. He said pickets were withdrawn from an east side restaurant yesterday after the cut was restored.

### Road and Bridge Fund Allotted to Bonneville

WASHINGTON, Aug. 10.—(P)—A \$221,810 WPA grant to the Bonneville power administration for road and bridge construction was approved today by President Roosevelt. The construction will be part of transmission line building from Bonneville to Condit and Vancouver in Clark, Skamania and Klickitat counties in Washington.
