

Wheat Fluctuates From War Scare

Trading Floor Crowded; Tumble Follows Early Rise

CHICAGO, Aug. 24.—A typical war-scare market, surpassing the trade of last September's crisis, took place in the wheat pit today, with prices swinging in a wide range.

An early advance of 2 1/2 cents, continuing yesterday's upturn and lifting prices to the highest levels in two months, was followed by a quick tumble of as much as 4 1/2 cents. Subsequently there were additional rapid price changes but the market quieted down and steadied, closing unchanged to 1/4 cent lower compared with yesterday's finish.

The reason for the nervous, erratic trade lay in the swelter of rumors coming from Europe. First buyers, then sellers took the lead as the trade tried to keep pace with events. The sharp slump that occurred after the first half hour followed reports that Canada again was offering wheat for sale in limited quantities.

Other grains moved largely with wheat but corn showed independent weakness due to increased country selling.
