

Woodburn Fair Plans Complete

Armory, Tents to Be Used to House Exhibits; Board Meets

WOODBURN—Plans for the 1939 Woodburn community fair were completed at a meeting of the fair board Tuesday night. It was decided that 26,500 square feet of space will be used in housing exhibits in the Woodburn armory and in tents.

Grange exhibits, floral show and individual exhibits will be displayed on the main floor of the armory, while textiles will be housed on the second floor. The hobby show and old time pictures will occupy the entire basement.

Three large tents will provide additional space. One tent will handle seating arrangements for the entertainment, which will include boxing matches and a full hour of wrestling Friday night, as well as a musical program by a well known group of radio entertainers. A second large tent will be used to house commercial exhibits, the newest feature of the fair.

A space covering 55x100 square feet will be devoted to this exhibit. A third tent will be used to house concessions and additional entertainment to be provided for visitors to the fair.

The Woodburn community fair has not been commercialized. The most important parts of the fair wish to see them.
