Farmers Cash in Crop Insurance

CORVALLIS, Sept. 21-(AP)-More than one out of every six Oregon farmers who participated in the crop insurance program cashed their policies in whole or in part, Clyde Kiddle, state supervisor,

Of 708 policies written, payments were made on 136, equal to 86.000 bushels of wheat compared to 18,500 bushels paid in premiums. Losses were increased by drought, hail, windstorms, frost and root rot, Kiddle said.

About 60,000 acres have been covered in new applications during the last three weeks. Kiddle said October 30 was the closing date for federal insurance on fall seed-


