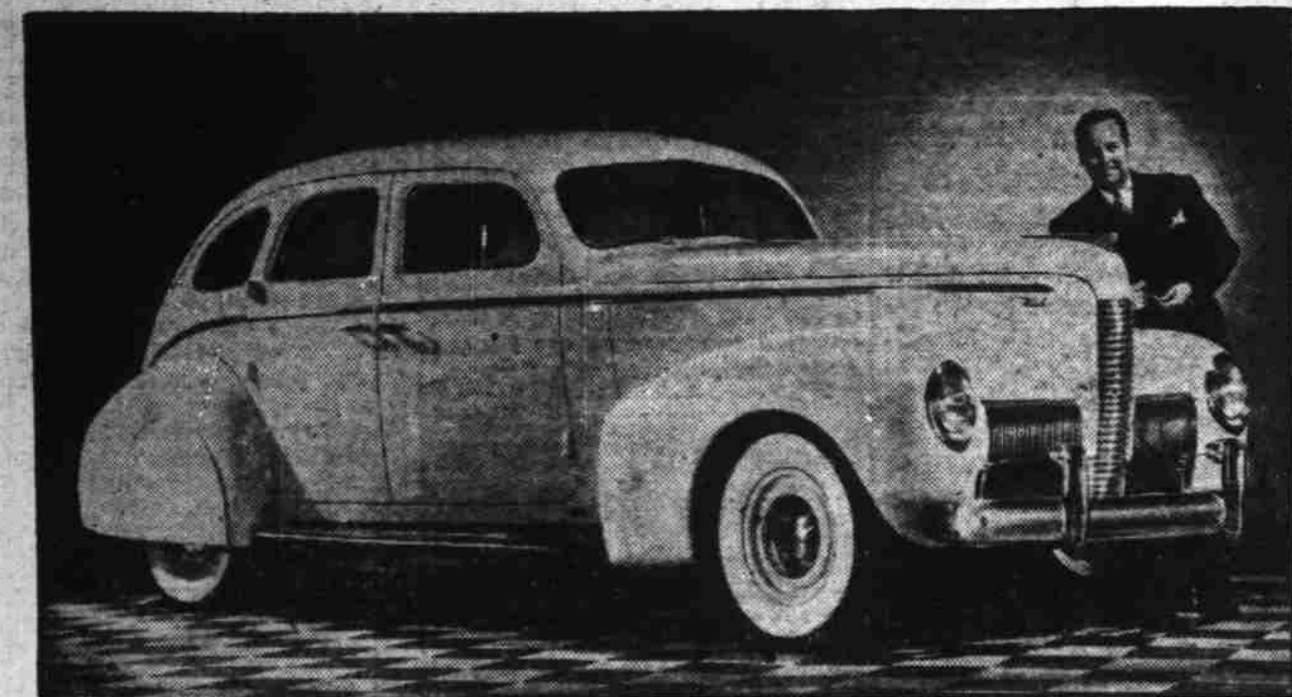
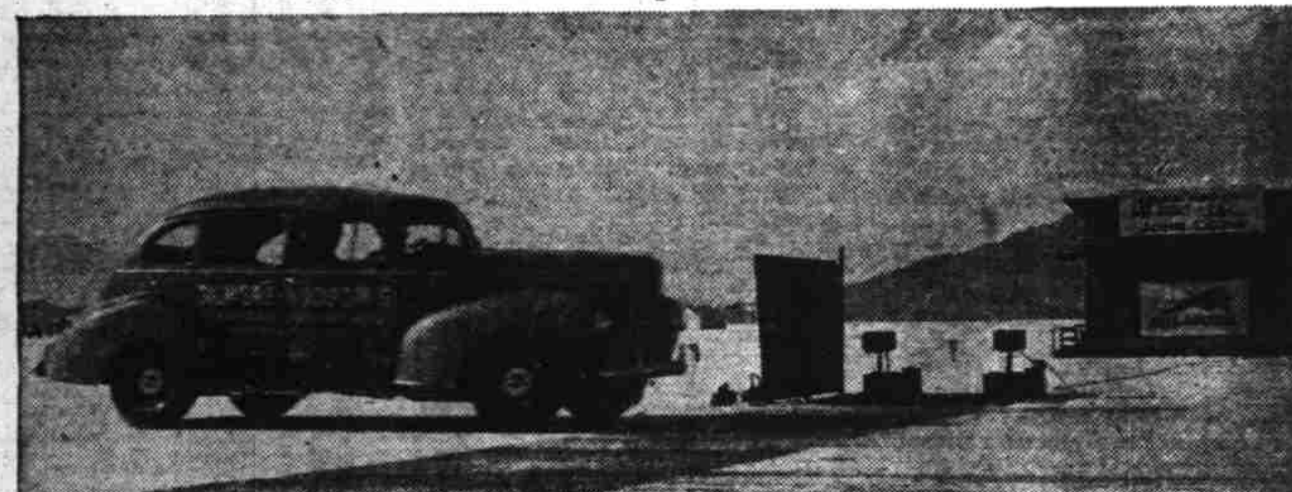

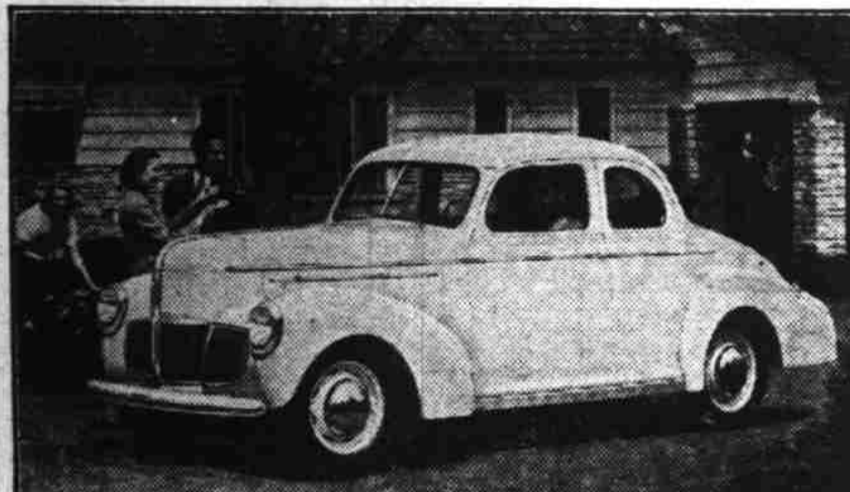
Clean, trim skyliners contributed much to the styling of new 1940 Nash automobiles, according to George Walker, noted industrial designer.

NEW YORK, Oct. 7.—(AP)—Offerings exceeded demand in today's stock market and leading issues were pushed down fractions to around 2 points.

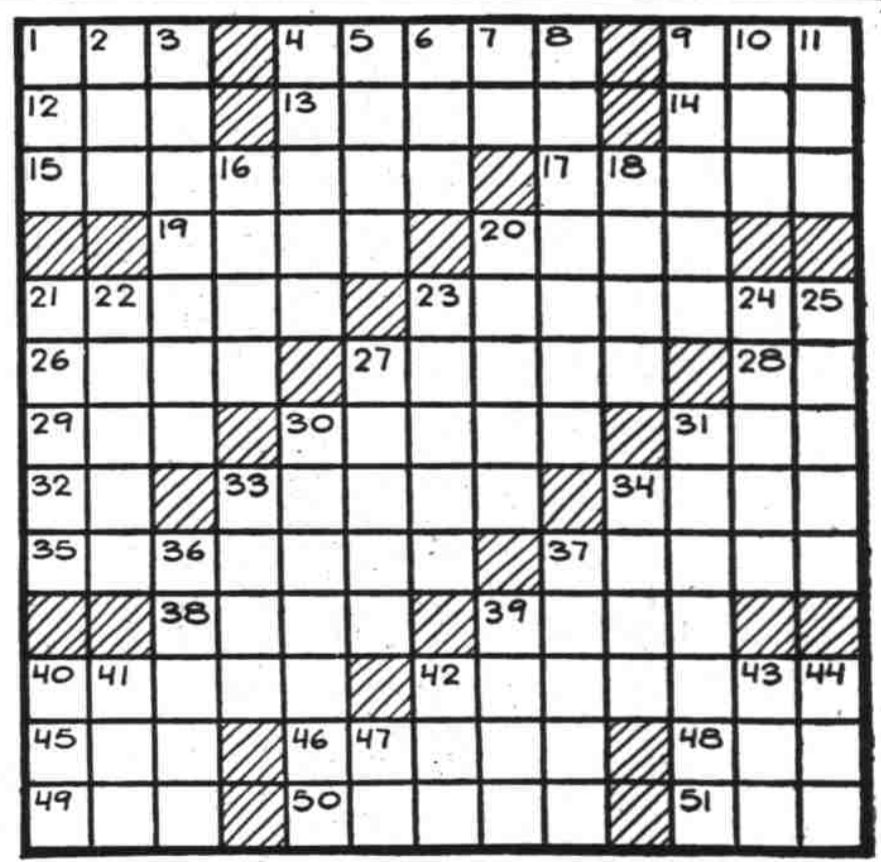
