

Says US Should Stay Out of War

Linfield College President Gives Armistice Talk To Lions Club

The United States should stay out of the present war in Europe," declared Dr. William G. Everson, president of Linfield college, in an Armistice day address to the Salem Lions club yesterday.

"Ultimately if war must come for us, we must see that there is going to be a nation big enough to go in and salvage something out of civilization," Dr. Everson added.

The present war, if advanced mechanisms and scientific developments are brought fully into play, could make the World war "look very small," Dr. Everson said, but he questioned the credit capacity of the nations, including the United States, to stand long the cost of supporting vast military organizations without mortgaging "not only the next generation but also its children."

The last war, the present one and the "grabs" and international maneuvers between the two, all give proof of what is wrong with the world today. "human selfishness," the speaker, a major general as well as a college president, asserted.

Refugee Sewing Will Start Soon

Sewing of clothes for refugee Poles will start soon in Salem, according to Mrs. C. S. Hamilton, chairman of the production committee of the Marion county Red Cross.

The quota, as received from the national headquarters, will include the making of dresses for women and children and the knitting of sweaters for men, women and children. The total quota for the country is 33,000 dresses and 136,000 sweaters.

Also going to European countries for the Polish refugees are drugs, blankets and warm underwear. These are being distributed by the German, Swiss, and Italian Red Cross organizations.

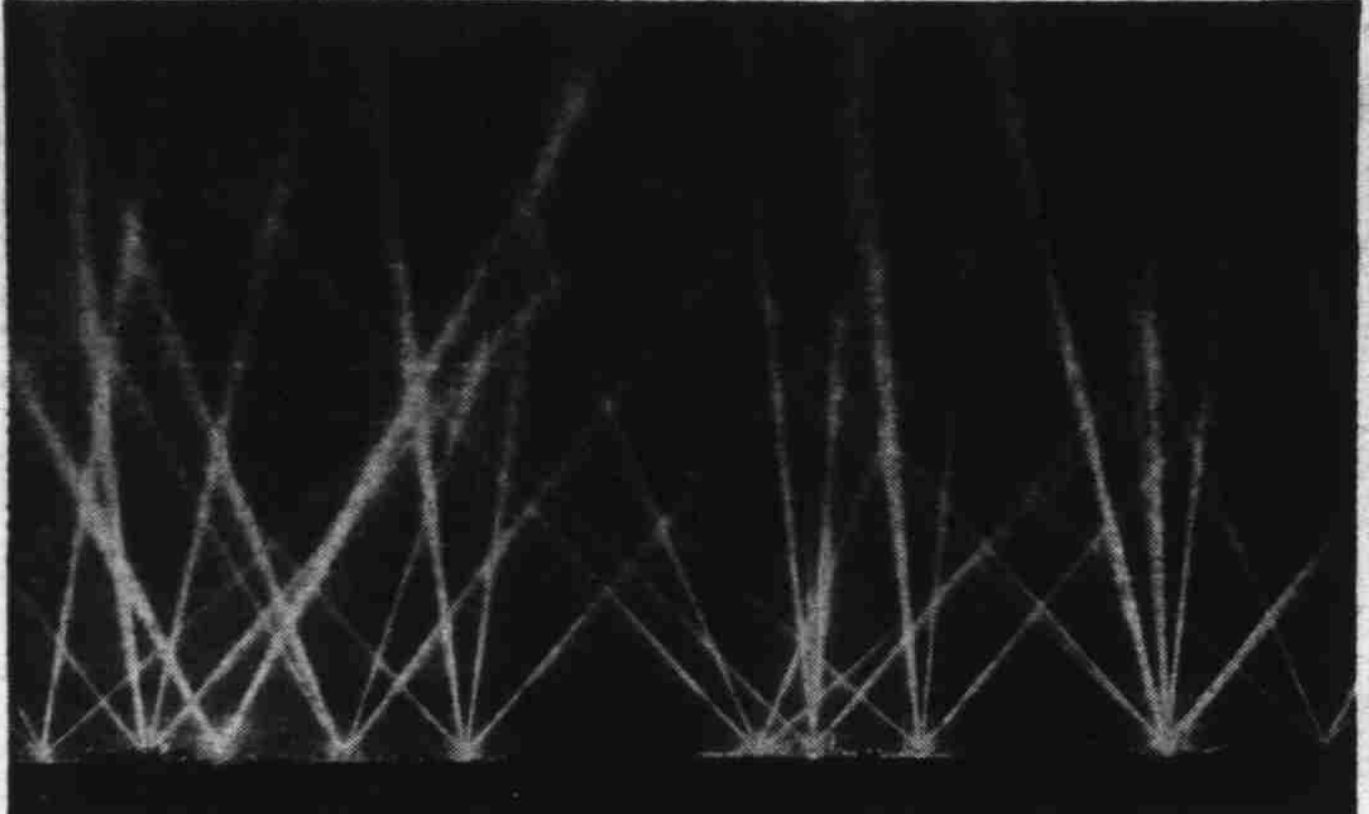
Members of the American delegation reported that no great need for food supplies was felt, but that epidemics were threatening because of the lack of clothing.

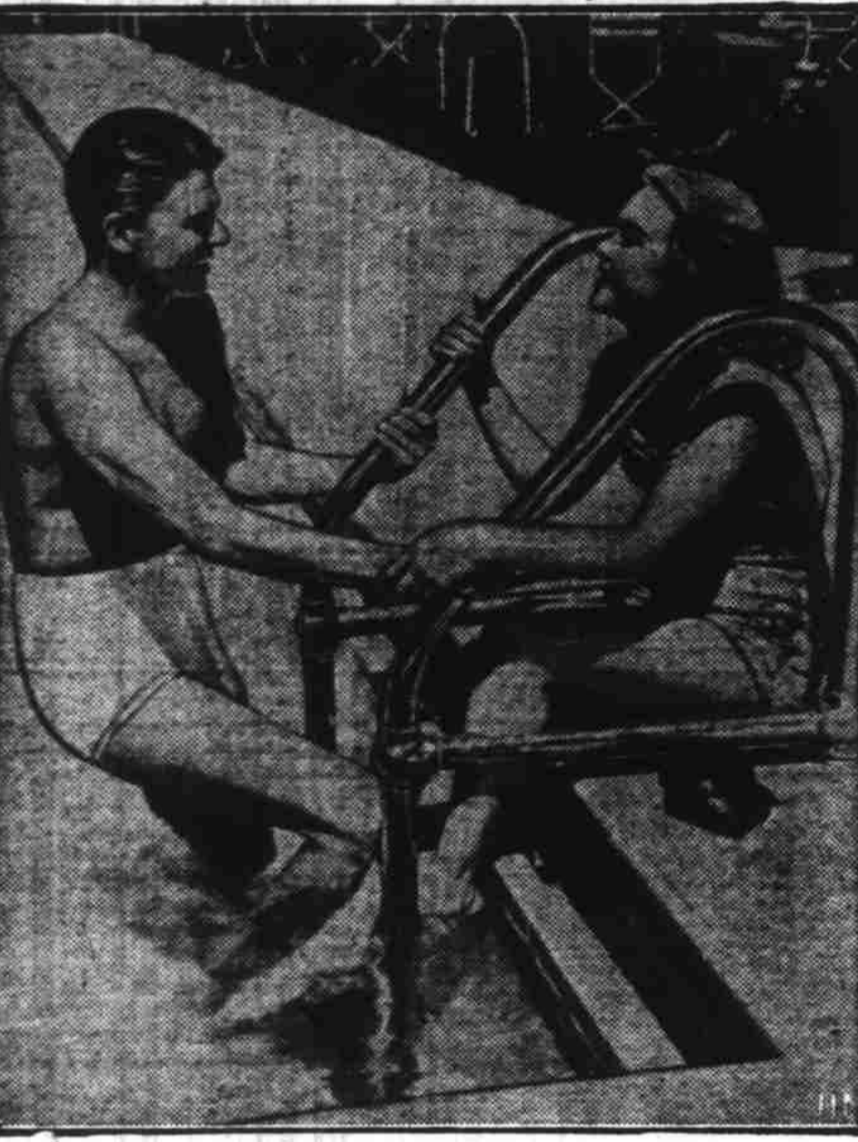
Orient Ship Line Sought by Dodson

Salem citizens in general were expected to start their Armistice day observance today by cooperating in the "Buy Friday" program sponsored by the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars and Disabled American Veterans. All stores will be closed on Saturday, Armistice day.

Plans had previously been completed for the Armistice day program which will include a parade starting at Marion Square at 10:30 a. m., followed by the patriotic exercises at the west entrance to the county courthouse about 11 o'clock.

Several special announcements in connection with the day's observance were made Thursday. The local post of the American Legion received word that a nationwide radio program would be broadcast from Arlington national cemetery in Washington, starting at 8 a. m.

The local post of the Disabled American Veterans is sponsoring an address over KSLM at 8:45 Saturday afternoon by Col. C. A. Robertson of West Salem.

Hoffman Paroled To County Sheriff

Judge L. H. McMahan yesterday sentenced Cyril Hoffman to two years in the state penitentiary and proceeded to parole him to the county sheriff on condition that he remain out of the state except for Marion county, abstain from liquor and agree to support his children.

His wife, who recently instituted divorce proceedings against him, stated at the hearing that she had no objection to his release so long as he would remain away from her. He previously made such a promise to the court which he later failed to keep.

The judge also sentenced Cecil A. Marvel, who pleaded guilty to a bad check charge, to six months in the county jail, and paroled him to the sheriff on condition he make the checks good, in the case of Yori Warthen, who pleaded guilty to burglary not in a dwelling, was continued for sentence at a later date.

Winslow Case to Go to State Supreme Court

The case of Frank Winslow, former Salem policeman, against Chief of Police Frank A. Minto to gain reinstatement on the force will be carried to the supreme court if the city council follows a recommendation made yesterday by the civil service commission.

Winslow was ordered reinstated in a decree handed down by Circuit Judge Arlie G. Walker Wednesday. Walker based his decision on the fact that Winslow had been granted no hearing before his discharge.

The civil service commission will ask the council to appeal the case to clarify the civil service amendment to the city charter, which provides for no hearing before discharge, a point which Walker's opinion intimates might be unconstitutional.

The commission's action was taken after Chairman David O'Hara and Alderman James H. Nicholson of the council police committee refused to sit with the body. Present were Brasier Small, A. A. Gueffroy and A. H. Moore, commission members; City Attorney Paul R. Hendricks; E. M. Page, attorney for Minto; and City Recorder A. Warren Jones.

Chief of Police Minto was instructed not to permit Winslow to return to duty until action as been taken by the council.

Chairman Small reported that a compromise had been offered by W. C. Winslow, whereby Winslow would not press a claim for about \$1300 in back salary if no appeal were taken.
