The pond is on the site of one of the old gravel beds frequently found in the Willamette valley, perhaps a former route of the Santiam river.

Linn county has replaced two old bridges—in the south Tennessee district, one an old covered bridge—with new ones to conform to county and state market road specifications. The approaches on each end have been raised and widened.
