## Chemawa Leads Victory Drive

### Braves Take Top Spot for Second Straight Year; 8 Teams Entered

Chemawa's galloping Braves for the second consecutive year led the west to victory over the east as the quintets from west of the Willamette hung up a 42 to 23 victory in the fourth annual Willamette Valley Inter-scholastic league basketball jamboree, held last night on the Willamette U court.

Sweeping up and down the court like a prairie fire, the Chicks swarmed over Molalla for a 15 to 7 victory to put the west out in front. Van Pelt, with six points, led the Braves as they posted the highest score of the evening.

Flouted by Elliott, who tallied six points, West Linn kept the west rolling by downing Woodburn 11 to 4 in the second contest, to raise the score to 26 to 11.

Strode, accounting for five points, led Chemawa as the Bery-pickers provided the only bright spot on the eastern horizon by conquering Independence 13 to 6. Any hopes for victory that eastern supporters might have held after the Lebanon victory were dashed by the black-shirted Dallas Dragons, who outplayed Silver-ton to ring up a 10 to 4 score in the final encounter.

Every contest provided its full quota of thrills and chills with the quintets going at it tooth and nail throughout the jam session. Though the clubs played aggressively from start to finish, early season raggedness and the short 12-minute quarters held down the scoring.

Between quarters awards were made for the 1939 WVI basketball season, Chemawa taking first place, Lebanon second, and West Linn third.

## Selected Stocks Make Advances

### Transfers Are Greatest for Month During See-Saw Session

NEW YORK, Dec. 7.—(AP)—Selected stocks pushed up fractions to more than a point in today's market despite frequent selling flurries.

An advancing trend at the opening soon turned into irregularity as some traders cashed in on the bulge of the previous session.

From then on it was a see-saw performance until the start of the final hour when an assortment of industrial specialties, including sugars and aircraft, touched best levels of the day. Top marks were reduced in the majority of cases, however, at the finish.

Despite the predominance of plus signs, The Associated Press average of 60 stocks emerged unchanged at 51.1 there were occasional slow-downs during the day, but transfers of 1,005,470 shares were the largest in nearly a month, and compared with 990,620 yesterday.

Among stocks in the front ranks were Bethlehem Steel, US Rubber, J. I. Case, Douglas aircraft, Sperry, Western Union, American Can, Westinghouse, International Mercantile Marine, Square D, Fajardo Sugar, American Sugar Refining, Standard Brands, J. C. Penney, Great Northern and Du Pont.

General Motors and Chrysler retained gains of 1/4 each. Slightly under water were Santa Fe, Standard Oil of NJ, Kennecott, American Smelting and Goodyear.
