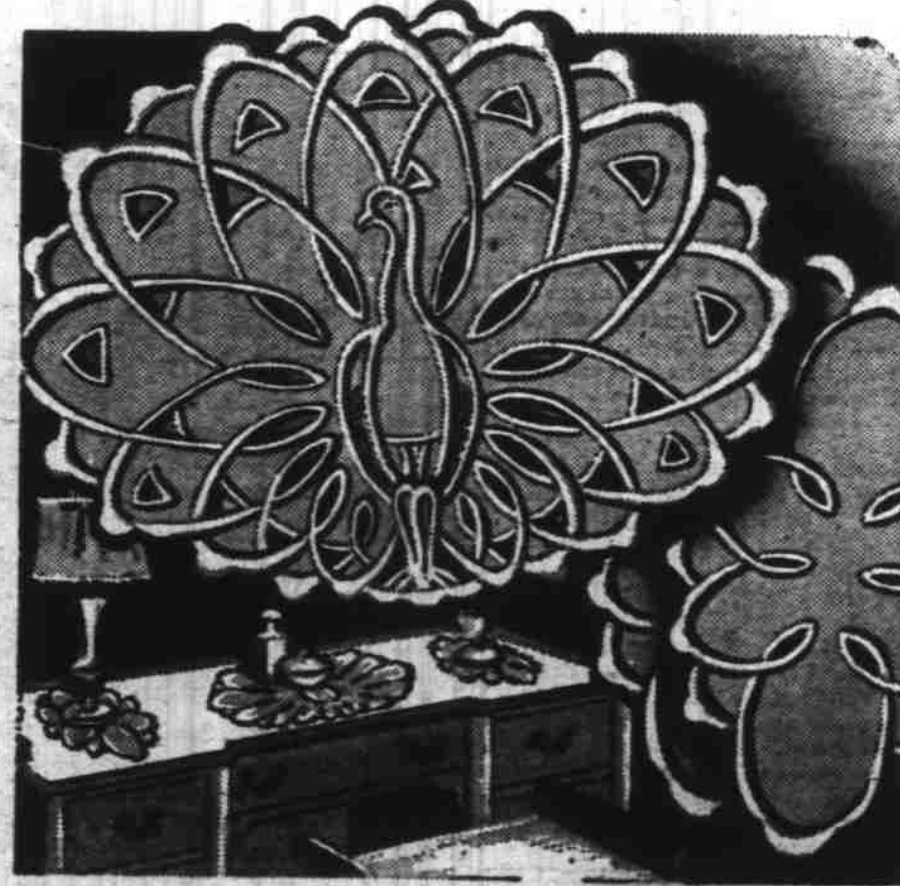

Marshmallows on Holiday List

Another orange candy suitable for the holidays is this marshmallow one.

ORANGE MARSHMALLOWS
2 tablespoons unflavored gelatin
1 cup orange juice
2 cups sugar
1 egg white
1 teaspoon grated orange peel
Powdered sugar

Soak the gelatin in 1/2 cup of the orange juice. Add the other 1/2 cup orange juice to sugar and boil to hard ball stage (250 degrees). Stir this into the soaked gelatin and beat until dissolved. Beat egg white until stiff. Gradually beat the gelatin mixture and orange peel into egg white and continue beating until cool and stiff. Pour into a square pan that has been buttered and dusted well with powdered sugar. When firm cut into squares with a sharp hot knife. Roll in powdered sugar. Keep in a covered container in refrigerator to retain moisture.

CHICKEN MUSHROOM CASSEROLE
Browned chicken
Seasonings
1/2 cup hot water
1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup
1/2 cup milk
Put the fresh cooked, or leftover chicken pieces in a casserole. Add water with soup and milk and heat. If the chicken is fresh and not previously cooked, put in the casserole with seasonings and water and simmer, covered, for about an hour or more, then add milk and soup.

Icebox Rolls Handy

A batch of icebox rolls in the refrigerator during busy pre-holiday time, will prove a handy hot bread for the family cook to prepare. This recipe will keep for awhile.

ICEBOX ROLLS
2 cakes yeast
1/2 cup lukewarm water
1 cup boiling water
2 teaspoons salt
1/2 cup shortening
1/2 cup sugar
1 cup cold water
2 eggs beaten
3 quarts flour (about)
Dissolve shortening, salt and sugar in the boiling water and add cold water. Dissolve yeast in lukewarm water and add egg and flour. Knead until smooth, put in a greased bowl and keep in refrigerator until ready to use. Will keep for two weeks. Allow 1 1/2 hours for rising before baking. Take from refrigerator and make into rolls, then let rise and bake for about 15 minutes at 400 degrees.
