Nurmi, Maki Tell Of Finn's Stand

Relief; Say Spring no Help to Russians

By BILL BONI NEW YORK, Feb, 3.-(AP)-They have come here as athlete and coach to raise funds for the relief of Finland, but it was as Mannerheim line infantryman and Helsinki air raid warden that Taisto Maki and Paavo Nurmi were welcomed to New York today.

As they came up the bay shorty after sunrise in the Norwegan-American liner Bergensfjord, the questions had very little to do with track. They dealt almost exclusively with Finland's great stand against Russia's numerically superior forces.

Maki, who looks like Bob Meusel and has taken over Nurmi's title of "phantom Finn" as well as most of his records, said the Russian soldiers were "very bad" but their arms and equipment "excellent." The blue-eyed, curly haired, ruddy-faced 29-year-old runner denied he had been wounded in his six weeks at the front, but said he had suffered a slight touch of rheumatism in his right knee. er, said today. The democratic party officials returned the check after first accepting it for "advertising" in discussing an Ashland federal building with administration ex-


ecutives at Washington, DC. "The community acted in good faith because of a sadly needed postoffice," Miller said.
