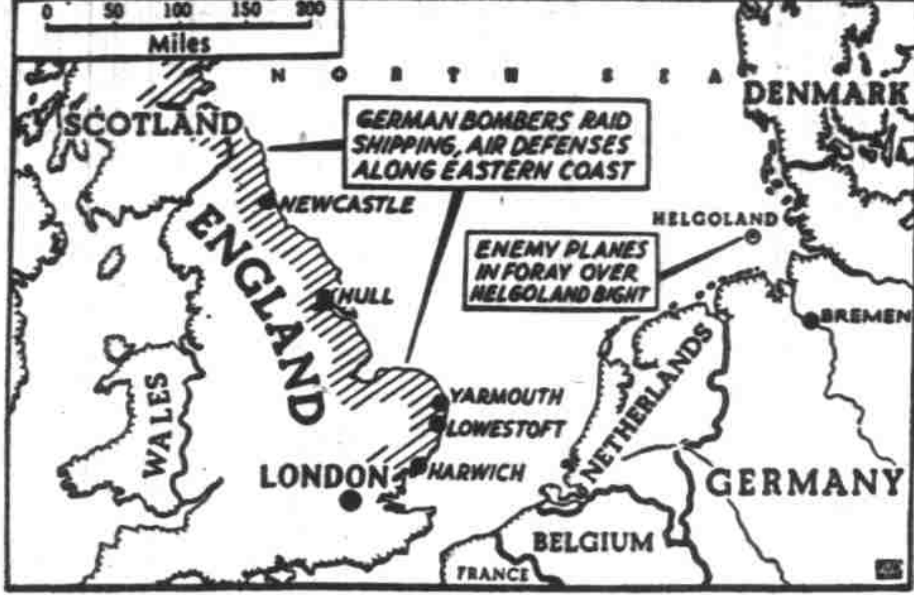
Mt. View PTA To Meet Friday
