

Hull Policies Are Extended

Administration Wins Its First Big Victory by 216-168 Margin

crease his prestige as a potential democratic presidential nominee. Republicans lack Southern support.

Hull had fought for such a program for years before he became secretary of state in the Roosevelt cabinet. Arguing that a revival of world trade depended principally on the elimination of such trade barriers as high tariffs, he obtained congressional approval for a three year trial of his policy in 1934. The time was extended another three years in 1937.

Under the legislation, Hull has negotiated agreements with more than a score of nations, which have reduced their tariffs in return for reductions in the rates of the Smoot-Hawley law, enacted in 1930.

Republicans came to the present session of congress resolved to end the policy, which without the legislation approved in the house today, would expire next June.

In addition to the members from particular areas which felt that their constituents had been hurt by the reductions, there was a large group which has contended as a matter of policy for high tariffs.

In that region, to get back to Germany.

(Authoritative British sources in London declined to discuss Scandinavian advances that allied warships had begun a blockade of Arctic waters off Murmansk. French officials said they had "no information.")

Scandinavians shrugged off rumors that the British intended to land troops and equipment in the Petsamo area—occupied early in the Finnish-Russian conflict by Russian forces—as an aid to Finland on the grounds that weather if no other factor would be against such a procedure.

Likewise there was no support of rumors that a clash with the Soviet Arctic navy already had occurred.

"The loss of foreign trade in lumber," Greeley said, "has brought an emergency to the Pacific northwest." He called for a thorough congressional investigation of the situation.

A small appropriation by congress to equalize export rates would go far toward stabilizing the industry, Greeley testified. He said subsidized Canadian shippers had a business which United States exporters had lost.

Other northwest lumber spokesmen were C. G. Kinney of Portland and W. B. Nettleton of Seattle.
