Jeanne Lee Is State Winner

Will Make Pilgrimage to Washington, DC, for DAR Sessions

A Woodburn high school senior, Jeanne Lee, was chosen yesterday by the Oregon Daughters of the American Revolution to make the annual good citizenship pilgrimage to Washington, DC, in April.

Final selection was made from a list of 23 senior girls representing the highest entries from each of the Daughter of American Revolution chapters sponsoring the good citizenship pilgrimage contest in the high schools of the state.

Alpha Whitlock, Medford, and Barbara Jane Wood, Jefferson high school, Portland, were selected as first and second alternate respectively.

Those making the election were Jeannette I. Dentler, state chairman of the DAR good citizenship pilgrimage committee; Mrs. Howard P. Arnest, state vice-regent, Oregon Society DAR; Mrs. Iva M. Brice, all of Portland, and Mrs. John Carlin, Salem.

William Jones Pleads Today

St. Paul Robbery Case to Go to Grand Jurors; Trial Question up

Trial of William Jones, thwarted St. Paul bank robber, and his wife, Myrtle, implicated with him in a holdup of the Canby bank, in state or federal courts will probably be decided today in a conference between District Attorney Lyle J. Page of Marion county, the county attorney for Clackamas county, where Mrs. Jones is held, and federal authorities.

Two indictments were returned against Jones on Thursday by the federal grand jury, one for the St. Paul holdup and the other for the Canby affair, and a single indictment against his wife for the latter robbery.

The charge made in the federal indictments is "larceny of property of a bank the depositors of which are insured, by the federal deposit insurance corporation, by force and violence and by putting in fear."

An attempt to serve a federal warrant for Jones failed at the courthouse here Thursday night when Deputy Sheriff H. H. Dan-

iels refused to surrender the prisoner without permission of District Attorney Page. It is not known whether a similar warrant was served on Clackamas county authorities for Mrs. Jones. The prisoner took 24 hours to enter plea yesterday when taken before Justice of the Peace Miller B. Hayden for preliminary hearing.

He was ordered to return at 11 a.m. today, and his bail increased from \$5000 to \$10,000. Bail has already been set at \$10,000 each on his two federal indictments.

On Jones' plea that he was without funds with which to provide legal counsel for himself, the judge appointed an attorney to represent him.

Bank and Building Figures Go Higher

PORTLAND, Feb. 29-(P)—Portland's bank clearings and building permits gained in February, although export and import receipts were light.

Clearings totaled \$117,742,292, compared with \$101,139,923 for the same month a year ago. For the first two months of 1940, the total was \$233,862,314, against \$223,667,883 for the same period in 1939.

The city issued 361 building permits with a total value of \$652,525, including 94 for new residences to cost \$410,650. Last year 318 permits were issued for \$970,039, of which \$341,400 was for new houses.

Portland district foreign exports totaled \$1,588,254, compared with \$2,552,300 for the same period in 1939. Customs receipts were \$60,000, about half of the 1939 revenue from imports.

Ruth Bryan Rohde Believes America Able to Stay out

PORTLAND, Feb. 29-(P)—Ruth Bryan Owen Rohde, former minister to Denmark, said today she does not believe America will enter the European war.

"We have very wisely prevented Americans from traveling under conditions jeopardizing their country's peace," the daughter of William Jennings Bryan said. "She believes, however, that America will participate in peace conferences following the war."

As for the visit of Sumner Welles, assistant secretary of state, to Europe, Mrs. Rohde said "there must be some wise reason" for it.

Gas Company Has Expansion Plans

PORTLAND, Feb. 29-(P)—A \$600,000 capital expansion to increase production of benzol, a motor fuel base, was announced today by the Portland Gas & Coke company.

The board of directors said 90 per cent of the holders of \$9,674,000 in company bonds had approved the expansion, which is planned to produce other by-products as well. The American Power & Light company agreed to put up the \$600,000 for construction of a new by-products plant.

The firm serves Vancouver, Wash., Portland and several Willamette valley towns.

Buffalo Meat Is Seen on Markets

Buffalo steak? Sounds like early days on the plains. But this week buffalo meat is to be had in Salem.

Nearing extinction, the buffalo was restored as a meat-producing animal by Michael Pablo, western Montana halfbreed, who captured four calves that became the nucleus for a herd now cared for on the Flathead Indian reservation, according to W. J. Busick, local market proprietor. The meat is butchered and prepared for market under government supervision.

Earle Criticized On Dealer Permit

PORTLAND, Feb. 29-(P)—Hugh H. Earle, state insurance commissioner, was criticized by the Oregon Insurance Agents' association today for issuing 122 state licenses to General Motors automobile dealers.

The licenses permit the dealers to write automobile insurance covering fire, theft, comprehensive and collision insurance on "financed cars only."

G. W. Haerle, association president, said the action was a "distinct surprise." He asserted that Earle agreed with the association last October that licenses should not be issued to automobile dealers.

Earle will be succeeded as commissioner April 1 by Seth B. Thompson.
