MAGIC GRAPE FREEZE

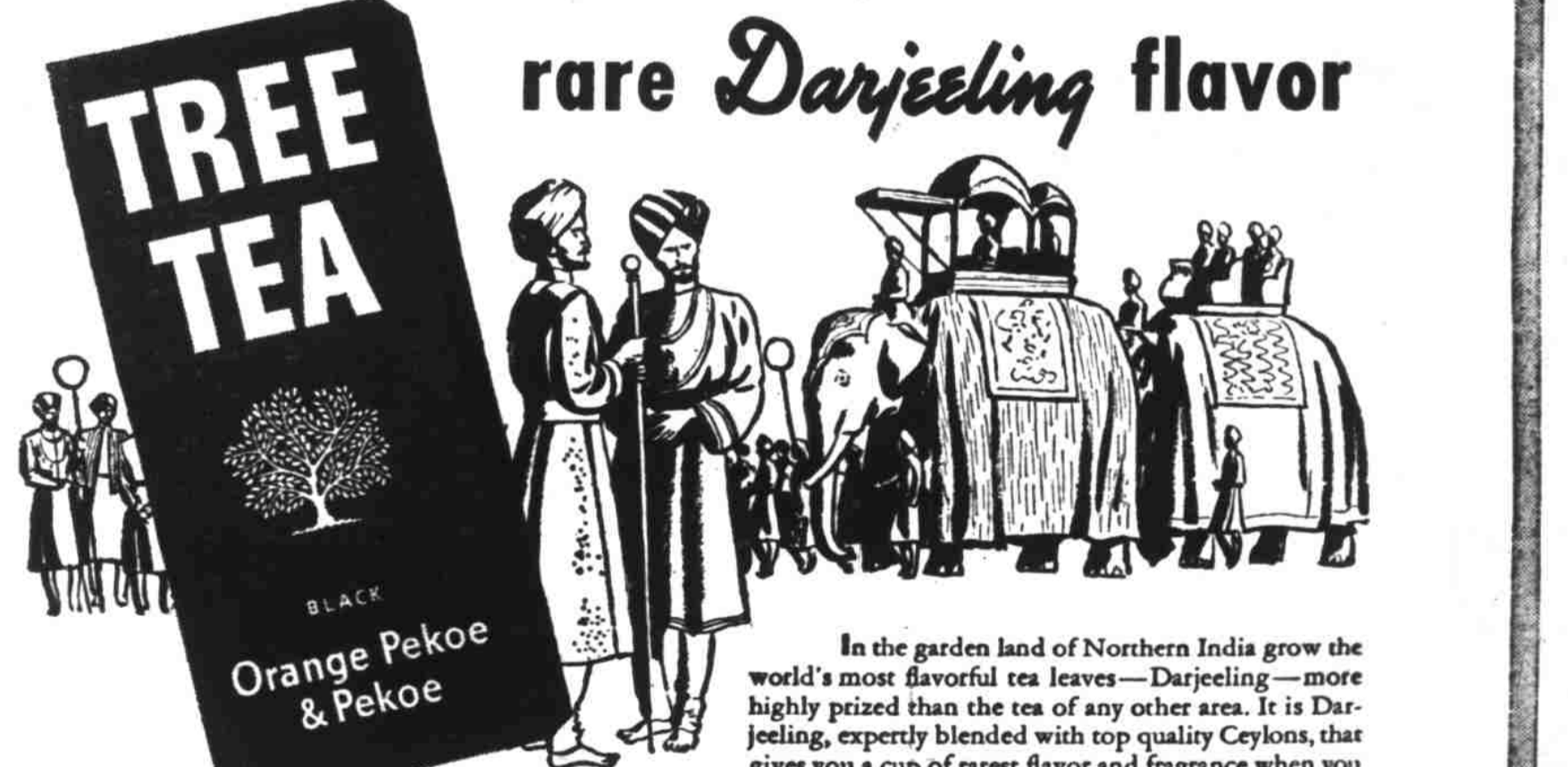

(Made with pineapple preserves) 1/2 cup soft bread crumbs 1 cup milk, scalded 1 egg slightly beaten 1/2 pound ham, ground 1/2 pound pork, ground 1/2 teaspoon black pepper 1/2 cup water or other liquid 1/2 cup sliced sweet pickles 2 pinchos, chopped 1/2 cup pineapple preserves
