- IMPORTANT:** Carefully observe timing for each method. Measure 2 level tablespoons of coffee to each cup of water. Very water slightly for exact strength desired. Keep coffee-maker clean.
- DRIP METHOD:** 6 to 8 minutes preferred. If less than 2/3 capacity is made, water will drip too fast, giving weak coffee.
- GLASS VACUUM-MAKER:** Put upper bowl on after water boils. The coffee and hot water should be in contact 5 to 7 minutes.

- PERCOLATOR:** Start with cold or hot water. Percolate slowly 7 to 10 minutes after steady pumping starts.
- COFFEEPOT:** Bring coffee to boiling. Stir. Remove from fire. Add a little cold water and let stand 5 minutes to settle.
- STEPPING:** Pour boiling water on coffee. Stir well. Stir again in 5 minutes. Steep for a total of 10 to 15 minutes.

Hint of the week

Keep the coffee-maker clean. A scrupulously clean coffee-maker is essential to making good coffee. Coffee oils tend to cling to the inner surface of the machine and eventually impart an undesirable flavor to the coffee.
