Three Schools Join Program

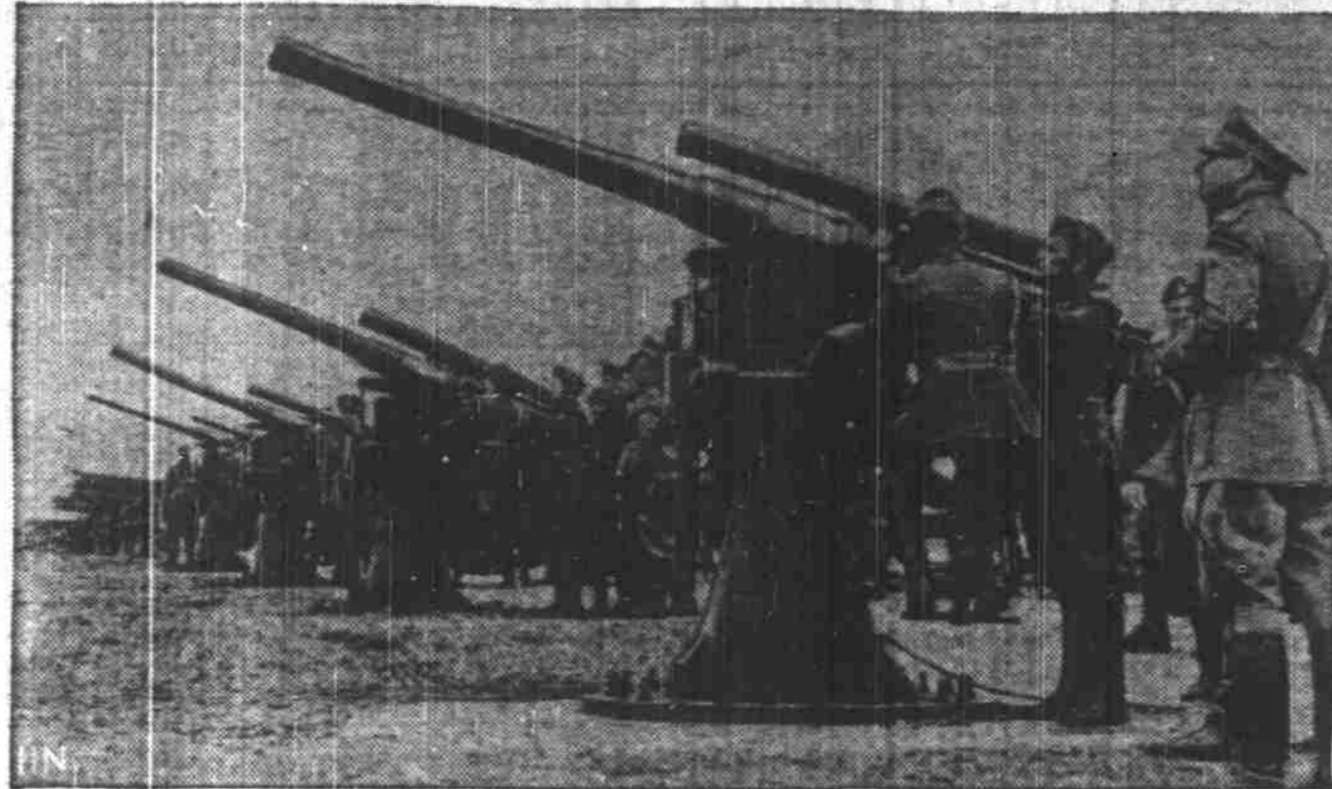
Jefferson, Looney Butte, Sidney Students Will Observe Music Week
