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miles further south, were regarded as mere tactical maneuvers. All main cities held by Germans.

The Germans, with the British pulling out of the Gudbrand valley, further to the west, simply abandoned their effort to get through the more difficult eastern Glomma river road.

As matters stand, the nazis are in possession of all of Norway's main cities and industrial centers, with the exception of the Mandalen sector north of Trondheim, where the allies are entrenched. At the port of Narvik in the far north a small garrison of Germans still is holding out against the allied forces.

It was not an easy victory for the Germans. All indications point to the fact that they encountered more resistance than they anticipated, but it is a significant victory nevertheless.

Only a tremendous allied campaign from the limited section of Norway remaining available to them can dislodge the German hold—and there even is speculation here that the allies may now withdraw from the Namsos sector.

The day's developments leave Sweden, lone Scandinavian neutral, exposed to the unhampered influence of Germany in as much as Swedish trade to the west is blocked.

Isolation Decried In Chamber Talk

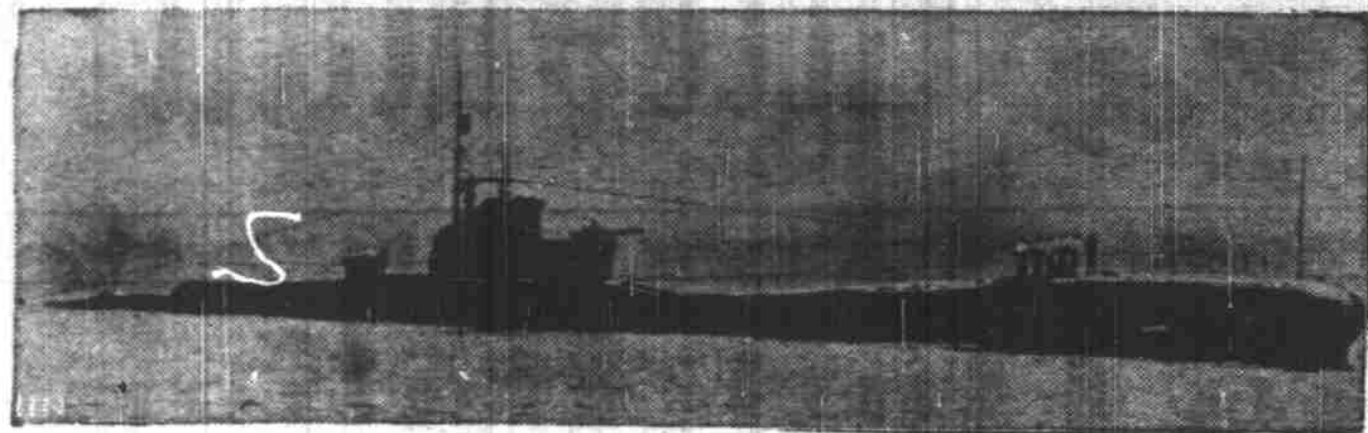

"But this course means ultimately the creation of a government here vested with sufficient broad and arbitrary powers to restrict our production to our internal demands, to plan our consumption so that it meets our production and thus to distribute whatever products we may cultivate or manufacture—not by the measure of the individual's capacity—but by the standards of a central planning authority, dispensing favors here, subsidizing efforts there, directing the production of synthetic articles which can be produced and obtained elsewhere in the world for less, expanding an ever-increasing part

of our production and our patriotism in a necessarily expanding system of national defense.

"To retreat to the cyclone cellar here means, ultimately, to establish a totalitarian state at home."

Douglas, who quit the New Deal in disagreement with its fiscal policies, spared neither the government nor business in placing responsibility for domestic ills. He called upon business men to demonstrate that they could support the national interest at the expense "of our pocketbooks, if need be." And, on the other hand, he said that continuation of the administration's spending policies would lead ultimately to "economic and social disintegration."

Ask Independence For Air Authority

WASHINGTON, May 2—(AP)—The civil aeronautics authority, apparently with White House approval, asked the budget bureau and the justice department today for assurance that it would remain entirely independent, although placed within the commerce department by a presidential reorganization order.

Chairman Robert W. Kinckley told reporters after a conference with President Roosevelt that the CAA propounded to Attorney General Jackson and Budget Director Harold D. Smith questions intended to "clarify and nail down" the future independent status of the board.

The replies from these agencies, he said, should be in the president's hands tomorrow. He added that if the questions were "confirmed," the secretary of commerce would have no authority over the CAA, and the department would merely "keep house" for it. He explained that by the latter expression he meant the department would furnish supplies and the like.

Kinckley said the CAA should remain independent because it was a "semi-judicial body."

Processing Farm Products Exempt

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including dried fruits, or in handling or transportation in connection with or incidental to such operations to the extent any employee is so engaged."

Previously the chamber had overwhelmingly reaffirmed a decision to grant a total exemption of some 200,000 persons in small farm cooperatives, and had adopted many other less controversial changes.

One tentatively approved amendment expected to eliminate many workers from the act's regulations would totally exempt all persons with a guaranteed salary of \$1,500 or a guaranteed monthly salary of \$200.

Representative Case (R-SD) author of the amendment, expressed hope that it would result in stabilization of both wages and employment.

Similar Provision In Committee Bill

The Norton committee amendments would have exempted workers making \$200 monthly or \$2400 yearly.

Turning aside from farm processing amendments for a time, the members adopted an amendment to permit a flexible work week for certain employees provided the total hours at the end of the year averaged 40.

This proposal, sponsored by Rep. Ramspeck (D-Oa), would apply to regularly-employed, salaried workers who voluntarily reached such an agreement with their employers. The compact would have to be approved by the wage-hour administrator.

Then the members overwhelmingly approved a proposal by Rep. Coffee (D-Ne) intended to exempt livestock dressing and packing plants from the hours limitations for any 14 weeks in a year. Other amendments which were approved, subject to final confir-

mation, would:

Exempt apple storage.
Exempt certain religious societies.
Eliminate entirely a controversial "area of production" phrase in the present law.
Exempt forest fire-fighters.
Exempt small wholesale grocers from hours provisions.

Germans Jubilant At Britain's Rout

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al by British Prime Minister Chamberlain. Chamberlain's statement came as Germans learned from the high command that an allied "head over heels" retreat had delivered virtually all of southern and central Norway into Nazi hands and that German bombers had rained new destruction on British sea forces.

"We look soon to the complete abandonment of Norway by the allies," declared one authorized commentator.

Twice today the high command told of several aerial blows to British warships in Norwegian waters, including two aircraft carriers and a cruiser.

It announced tonight that Ger-

man warplanes, attacking a strong British naval unit off the Norwegian west coast Wednesday, had struck one aircraft carrier squarely amidstships, causing heavy fire and smoke; found their target on another cruiser and scored a hit with a medium weight bomb on a British destroyer.

The high command said the German fliers dispersed the British warships. It reported two British warplanes shot down and said one German plane had failed to return.

King Haakon Remains In Norway, Announced

STOCKHOLM, May 2—(AP)—Norwegian authorities late tonight energetically denied reports that King Haakon had left Norway and come to Sweden.

They said the king still was "somewhere in Norway" with his government.
