

Silverton Pool Nearly Ready

Will Be Ready for Use in two Weeks, Hubbs Says

SILVERTON — George W. Hubbs, city recorder and purchasing agent for the Silverton swimming pool project, said Friday afternoon that the swimming pool would be ready for use within 10 days or two weeks.

WPA labor was halted Thursday noon. Two days later, the WPA project and these will likely be cured on Tuesday and Wednesday of next week. The remainder of the work will be completed with skilled labor provided by a recent vote of the city council.

Hubbs said that one thing which had held the pool up right now was the inability to get a single phase motor on the coast. He had to be ordered from the east.

It is believed likely that a man to watch machinery will be hired part time and a matron for the pool during the swimming season. It is believed that this will be included within the WPA recreational project.

Charles Watson, who has been hired as caretaker of the city park is busy cleaning up the park and it is believed unlikely that he would have sufficient time to care for the pool. However, it is expected that a WPA recreational project will come into effect early in the summer season.

The Parent Teacher association is in charge of mapping out the summer recreation program. That body voted to ask the Rotary, the Lions club and the chamber of commerce \$25 each and the Active club, VFW and the American Legion and their auxiliaries \$10 for the project. The PTA is cooperating with the park project of the city which will include the swimming pool.

Ray Goates of the senior high school athletic department has been selected as director.

Serving on the swimming committee from the city council are R. A. Fish, L. F. Tucker and A. L. Coote.
