Home, Sweet Home in a Bombed Belgian Town



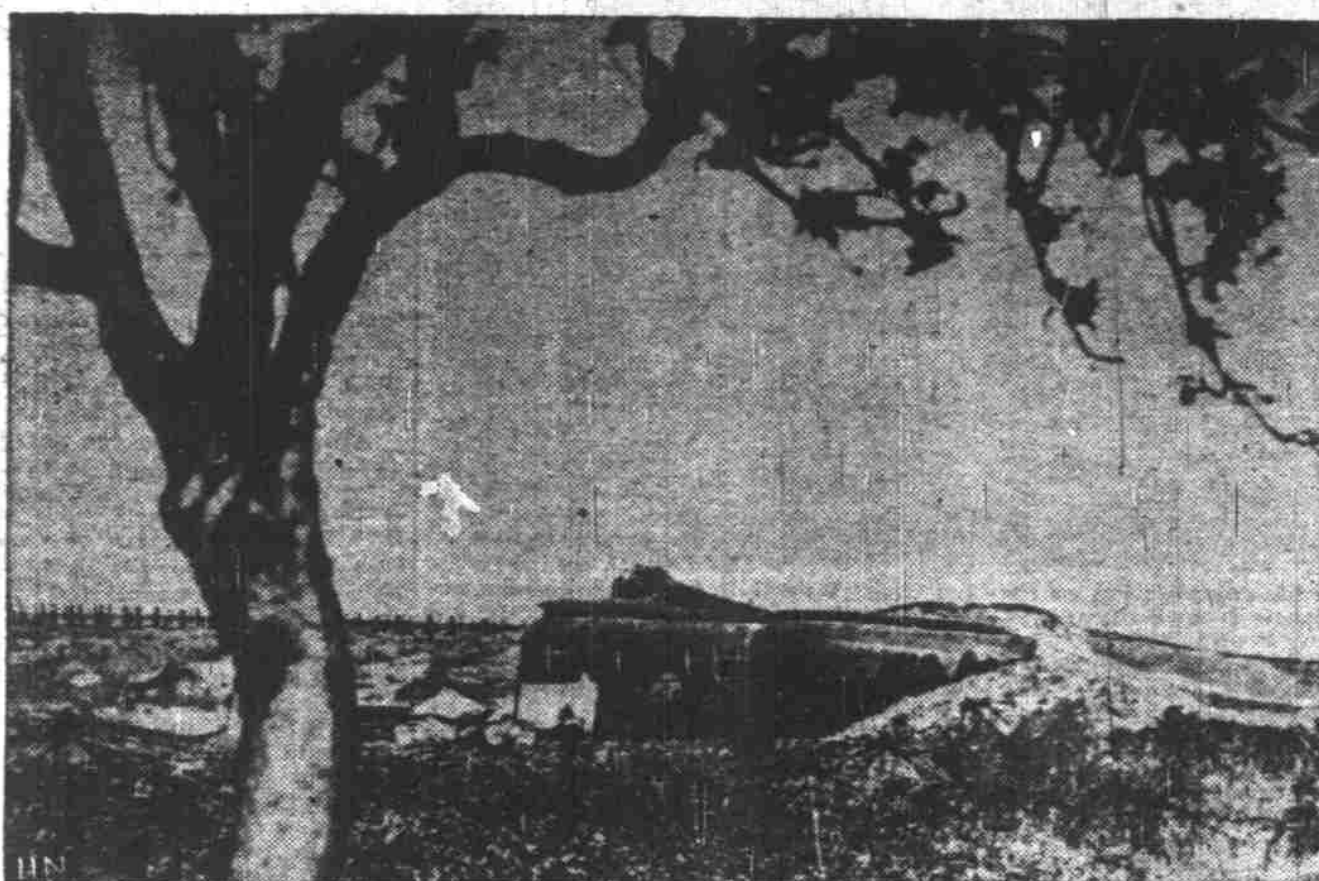
Pictures frequently tell the story better than words. This one does. The woman is a Belgian. The children are here. The town has been German air bombed. Their homes are gone. They are destitute.

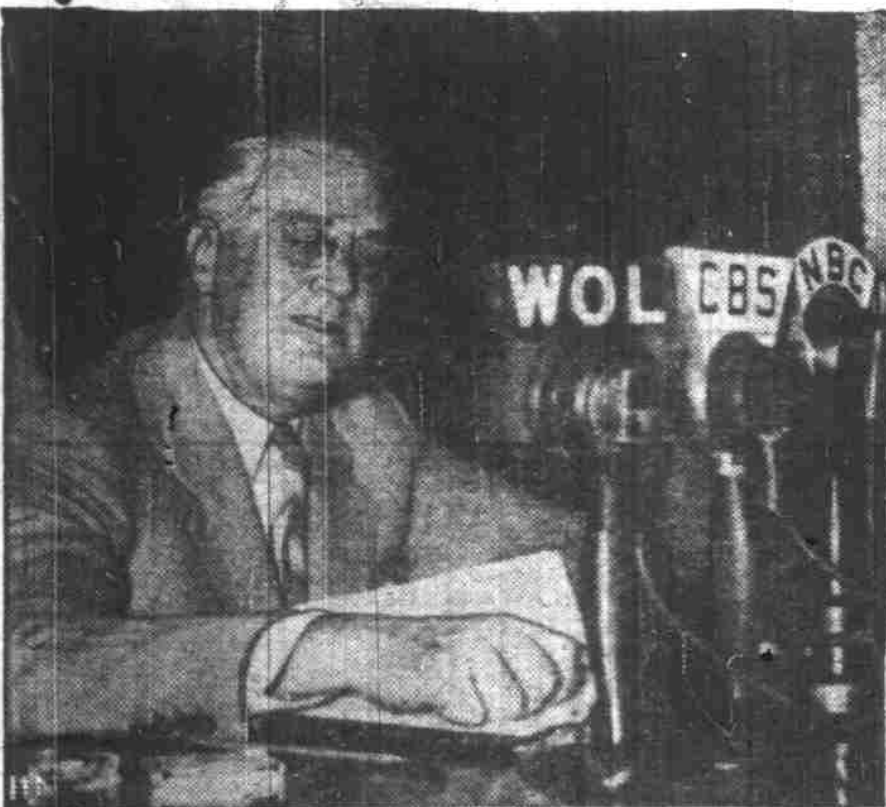
Nazi Headquarters Raided

In French Cabinet

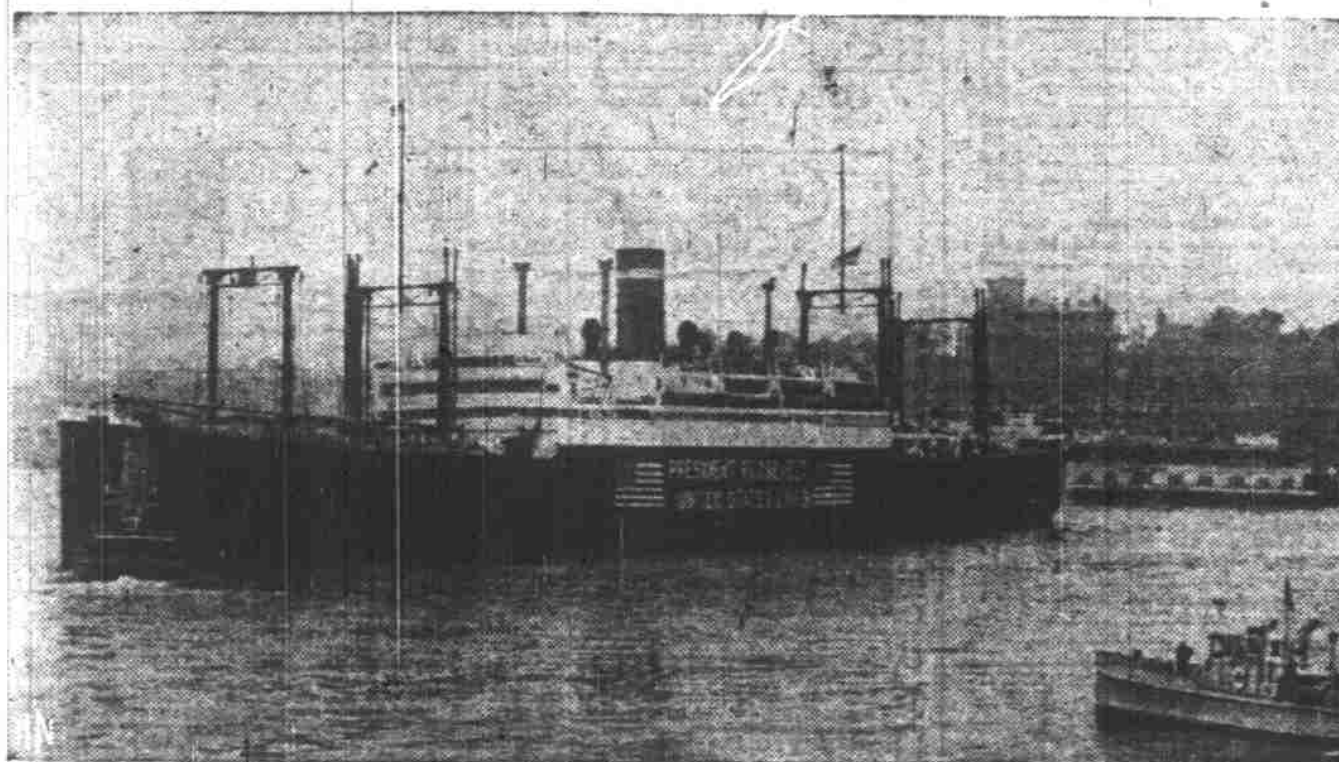
