

Committee Thinks Municipalities May not Like Employee Retirement Plan; Setup Would Be Mandatory

The governor's committee on public employees' retirement thinks it may get into hot water if it tries to force the political subdivisions of the state—counties, municipalities and special districts—to accept its proposed pension plan.

As the plan now stands, maximum benefits of \$83 would be paid to employees of the state and its subdivisions who worked 40 years and who reached the age of 65. The cost would be shared equally between the employer and employee.

Participation would be mandatory upon all state employees, as well as those of the state's subdivisions.

But the committee, realizing it may have considerable trouble in getting cities, counties and districts to accept it, wrote this in a memorandum:

"Certain questions arise as to the legality of such a provision in connection with municipal home rule. Legal counsel on this point will be obtained and incorporated in the draft."

The committee might ask the legislature to pass the plan containing such a provision. If the legislature does, it is possible that some city, county or district might upset the whole plan on grounds that the plan violates home rule.

The committee believes some of these subdivisions might not go for the plan because of the expense involved.

Baker died a few months later on the field of battle.

"We read like Chinamen, starting from the bottom and reading up. If there's no signature on it, we don't read it. No write name, we no read."

Ord, a former South Tacoma American legion official, testified for three hours late today. He declared he had lived with Mrs. Myra Nosler, 39, ten years prior to her marriage last February 23.

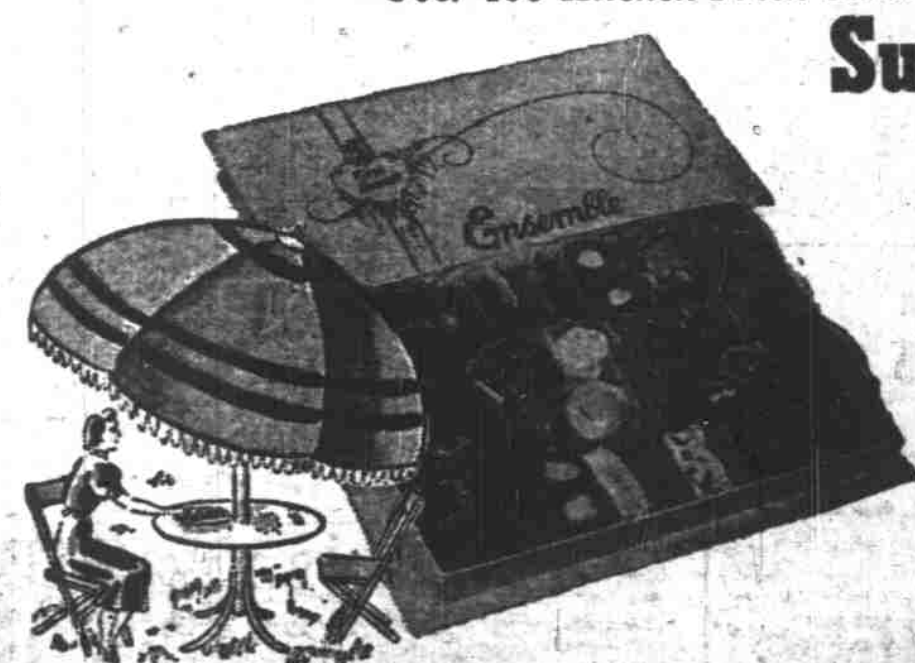
