**Stayton Paving Bonds to Be Bid**

**Engineer Confers With City Officials About Work**

STAYTON—The call for bids on the bonds to finance Stayton's street paving project has been announced. The amount is \$12,000 and the bonds will be in \$500 denominations and payable at the rate of \$1000 a year, commencing on July 15, 1941. Interest will be payable semi-annually.

The engineer, Walter W. Larson of Albany, who was hired for the project was in Stayton recently conferring with the city recorder, George R. Duncan, and Mayor W. A. Weddles about specifications for the construction.

The new city water main extending to the Pines addition of Stayton is making rapid progress this week. Workers are laying a four-inch pipe along First street from Ray Brenner's corner north for 700 feet. The old three-inch main will be reclaimed and used to extend the main still further northward. The people in this part of town have little water pressure and after the Pines addition is developed the larger main will be needed more.
