Chambers farm in the Dever community it was found that on a 14-acre field more than half of the pea plants had been defoliated and the seeds eaten. 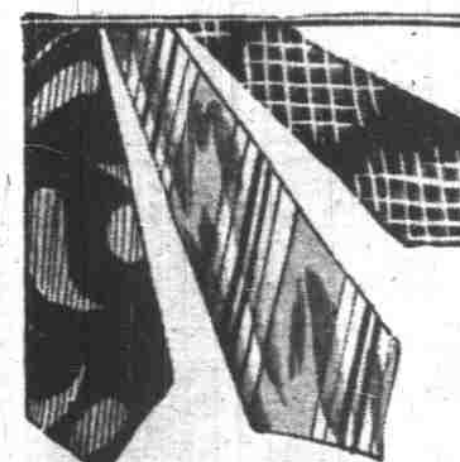
