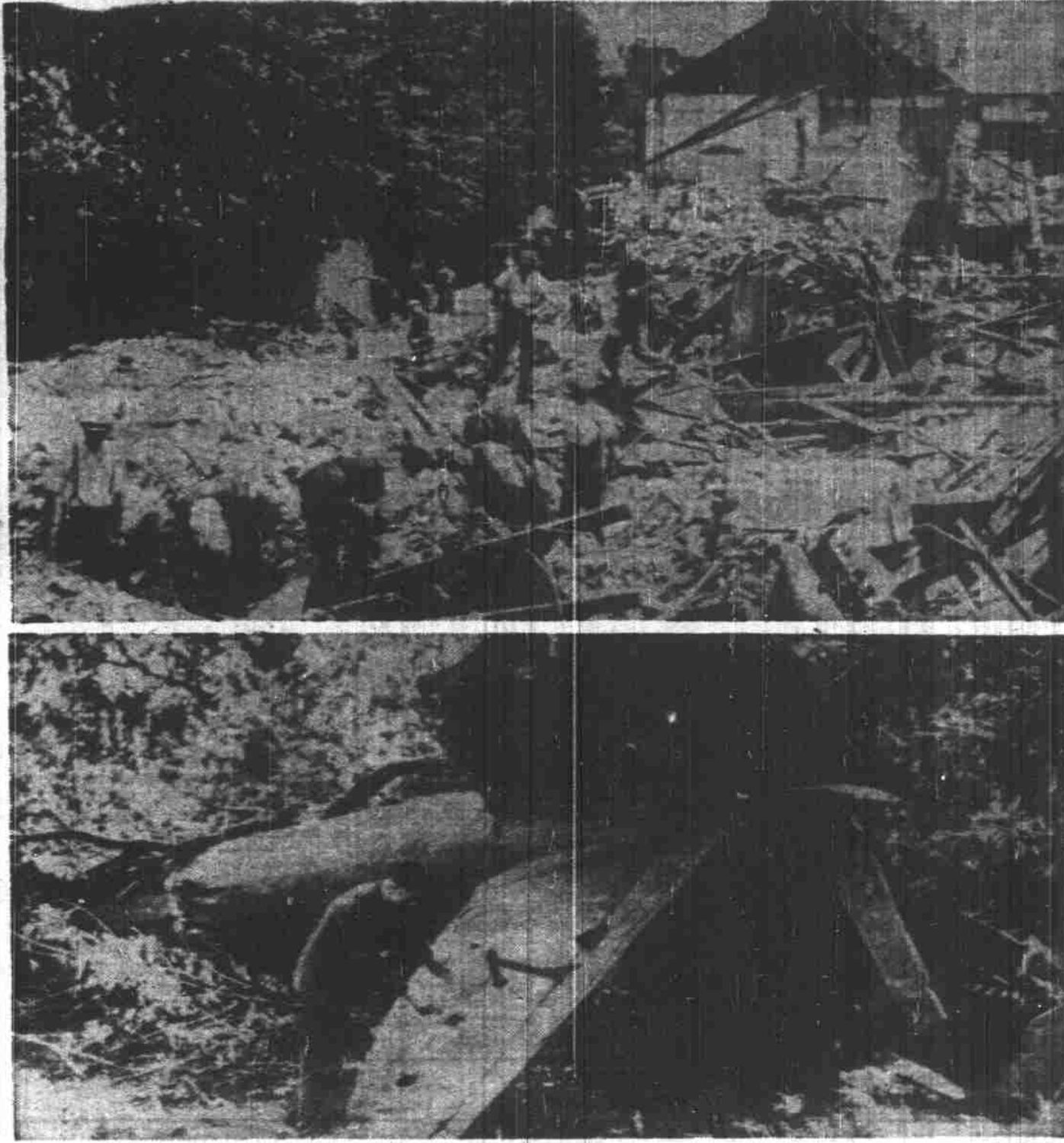


Nazi Bombers Raid English Town; 11 Die, 14 Hurt

Mrs. Frances Perkins

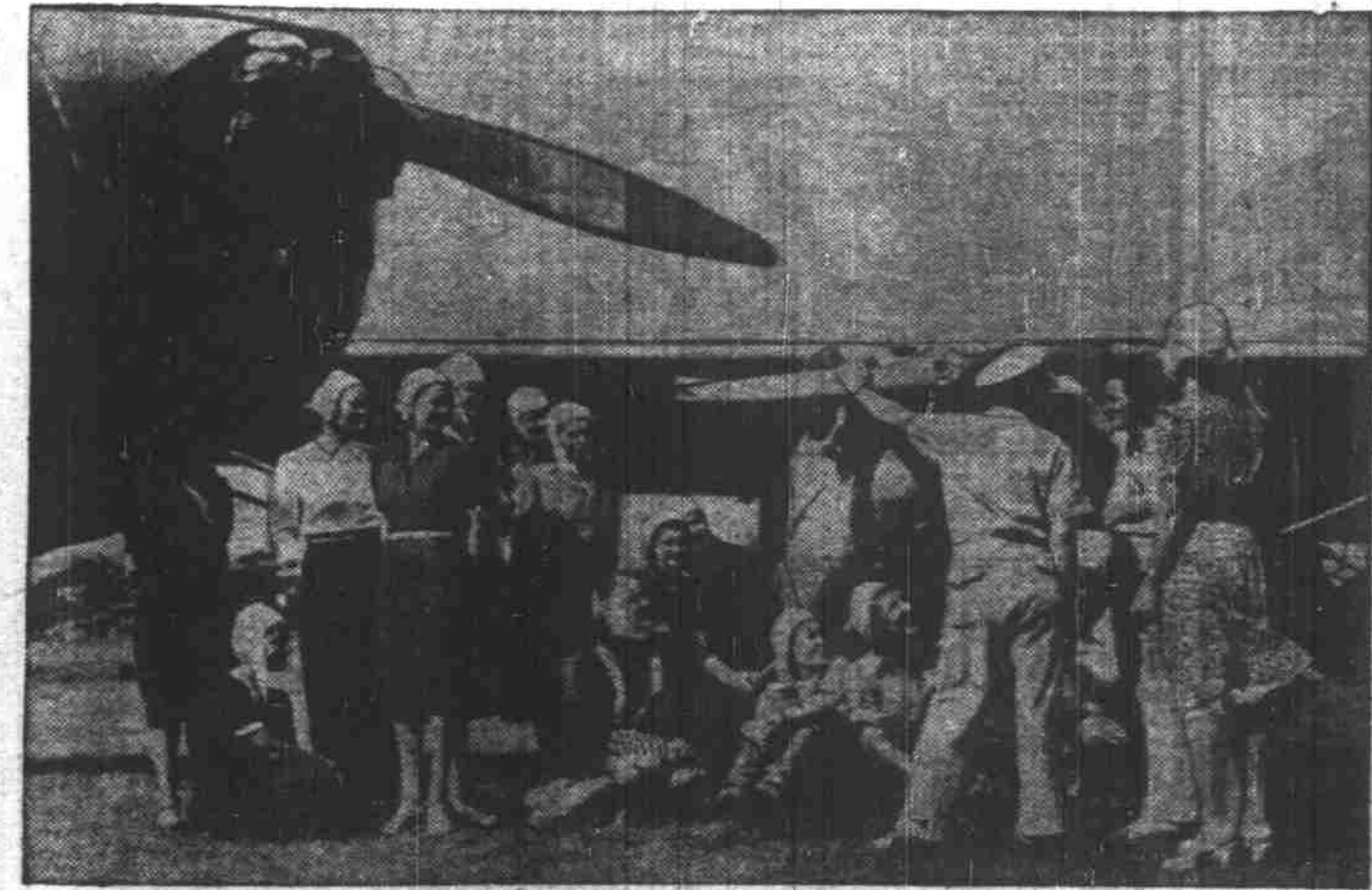

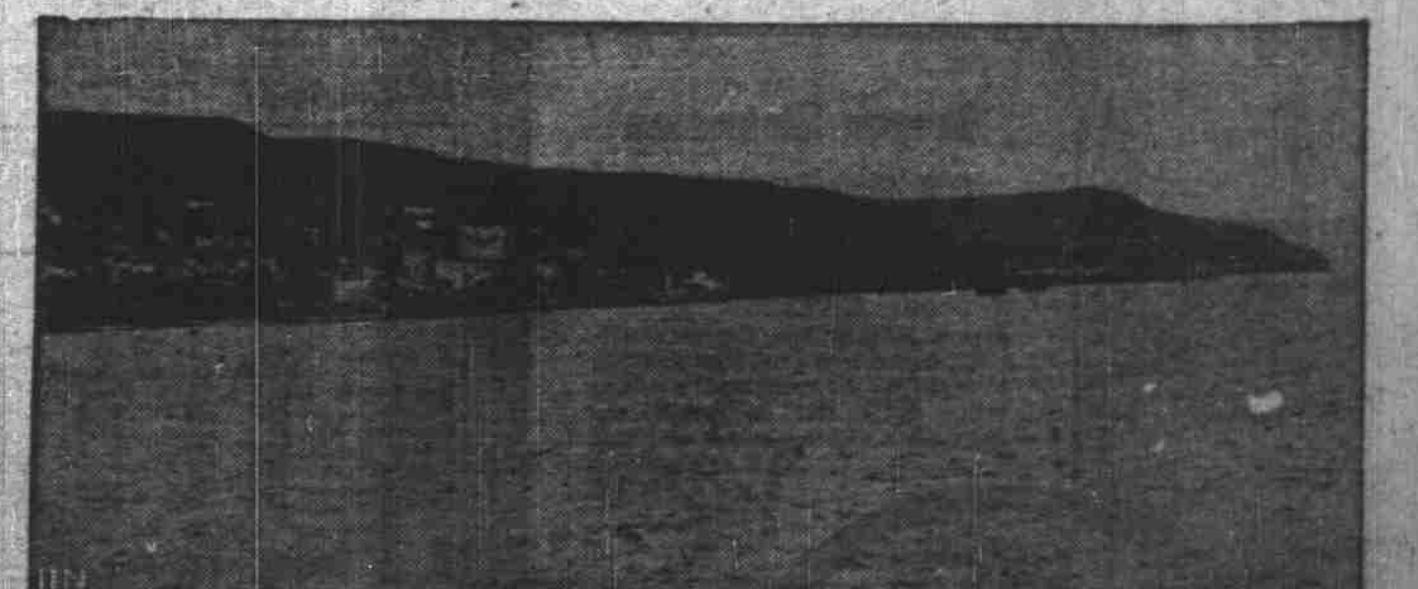
