Wreckage Sighted May Be Parts of Halliburton Junk

SAN FRANCISCO, July 5.—(AP)—Sighting of wreckage thought to be part of Richard Halliburton's ill-fated Chinese junk was reported to American President lines of fliers today by the liner President Pierce.

The message wirelessly from Captain Charles Jostad said: "Latitude 31 degrees north, longitude 174 degrees 40 minutes east passed driftwood resembling rudder of Chinese junk presumably Halliburton's. Heavy storms were covered by baranices of approximately one year's growth."

Halliburton, writer of adventure books, disappeared in mid-Pacific last year while sailing a Chinese junk from the orient toward San Francisco to the world's fair. Heavy storms were reported in the area at the time.

The President Pierce, en route to San Francisco, was between Kobe, Japan and Honolulu, when the driftwood was sighted.

Eugene Detective To Be Extradited

SACRAMENTO, July 5.—(AP)—The governor's office approved today the request of Lane county, Oregon, authorities for the return of William J. Hermann, private investigator, to Eugene on charges of kidnapping and assault.

Hermann was charged with forcing Edward Campbell to go with him to Klamath county and from there to Redding, Calif., to testify in connection with the investigation of the alleged murder of Emil Roessler, Redding musician.

An extradition hearing earlier in the week developed the fact that Hermann was hired by the Shasta county district attorney to find the belt buckle he Roessler was used to fatally beat Roessler last April.
