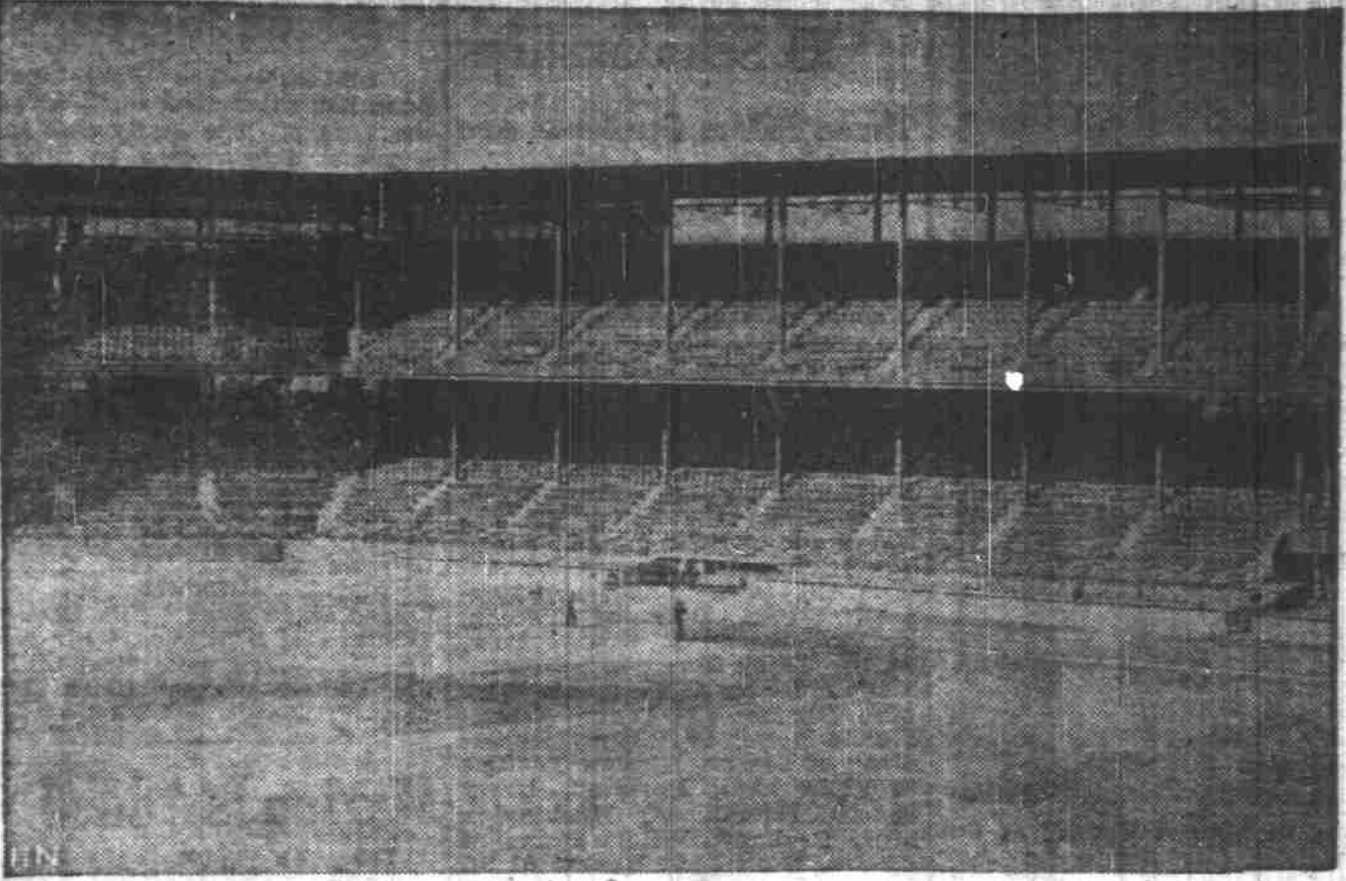


Sportsman's Park, St. Louis, Scene of All-Star Game

Big Smudge Jolley Takes WIL Bat Lead From Wild William; Wilson Tops Both but not at Bat Enough

While our Senators' Eddie Wilson had top percentage mark among Western International hitters for games inclusive of June 30, with a .384 average, he was not considered to have been at bat sufficient number of times to take the leadership away from Big Smudge Smead Jolley, the Spokane fencebuster who is in our town now.

Jolley's .367 mark, just one percentage point more than that of Wild William Harris of our Senators, included 106 hits, 26 two base hits, 16 home runs and an amazing total of 94 runs driven in.

The pitching leadership was held by Tacoma's Ray Medeghini, with six wins and one loss, followed closely by Spokane's George "The Duke" Windsor and Yakima's Carl McConnell, with 10 wins to two losses each.

2-Game Series Opens Monday

Second Thursday; Both Are in Conjunction With City Loop Bills

Never ones to look for soft touches even in the game of softball, Salem's Pade-Barricks are importing Sherry's All-Stars, said to be California's best, from San Francisco for a two-game series that will be played on Sweetland field here Monday and Thursday nights.

Monday's bill also includes a renewal of the Papermaker-Waits feud in the city league, while other games for the week are: Tuesday—Kennedy vs. Phosants and Schoons against Waits; Thursday—Kennedy vs. Square Deal in addition to the second Pade-Barrick-Sherry tilt; and Friday—Papermakers vs. Square Deal and Waits vs. Kennedy.

The invading Sherry's club, which continues on to Vancouver, BC, for games there, boasts a lineup believed almost certain to represent the state of California at the national tournament in Detroit early in September.

Emma Wong, Chinese-American girl who is their top pitcher, boasts a strikeout average of 10 per game. Her pitching partner, Frances Lorin, has twice held the Alameda state champions to three hits a game in contests played this year.

Warming up for their coming struggles with the Californians, the Pade-Barricks Friday night grabbed their fifth straight win, defeating Wells-Rold in Portland by a 5-1 score behind the five hit hurling of Madelyn Morgan.

The Red Cross is taking this means of raising at least a part of its quota rather than to ask for direct contributions. It feels that in this manner contributors will get their money's worth in entertainment in addition to aiding a worthy cause.
