AMITY—Officers were installed for the next term for Industry Rebekah lodge of Amity by Mrs. Gertrude Richter, district deputy president and her installing staff.

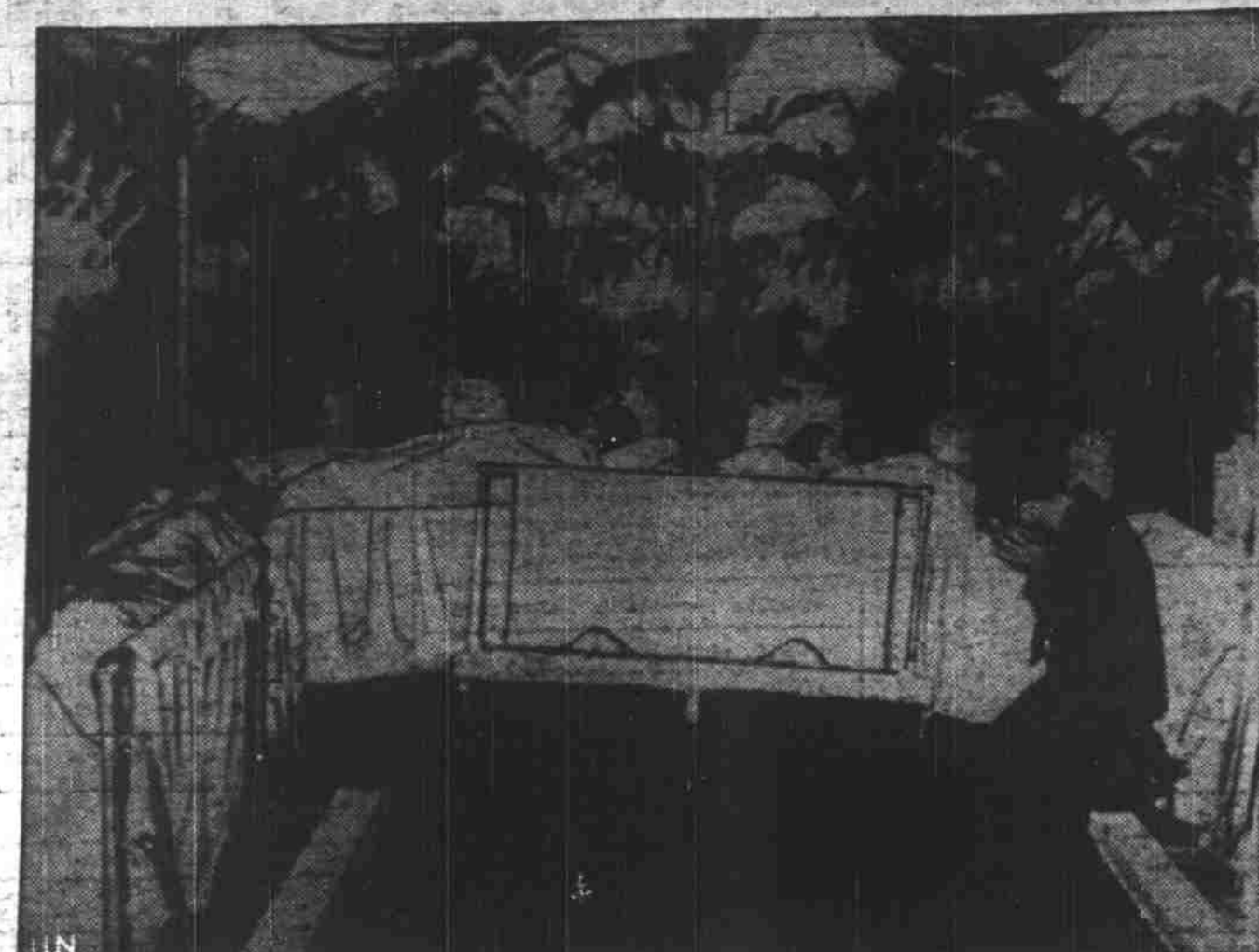
Silverton Faculty Changes Are Made
