By DALE STAFFORD DETROIT, July 26-(A)-Two golfers of scarcely more than local reputation qualified today for the 36-hole final tomorrow in the 19th annual national public links championship, the world's largest major golf tournament. The survivors of a field of 2610

linksmen who started the tournsment in sectional trials less than three weeks ago are Michael Dietz, a Detroit 23-year-old, and Robert Clark, 31, of St. Paul. Both conquered opponents of considerable prestige in semi-final

contests today. Dietz, playing in a pair of shoes half-size too small for him, beat Roy Dolce of Denver, 3 and 2. Clark was never behind but nevertheless had to go 38 holes before winning from the favored Edward J. Furgol of Utica, NY. Dieta' principal claim to golf-

ing fame is that he led 152 Detroiters in the public links qualitying round a few weeks back. Until a month ago he worked as a trimmer in the body building division of a Detroit automobile Clark is the present holder of

the St. Paul city title. A hardware salesman, Clark calls himself a "weekend golfer." He is the father of two children.
